AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH CHAPTER XI, ENTITLED "HOUSING" MORE SPECIFICALLY SECTION 11-4.14 ENTITLED "PENALTY FOR VIOLATION" SAME TO BE DELETED AND REPLACED BY THE LANGUAGE CONTAINED HEREIN.

INTENT OF THIS ORDINANCE

This Ordinance intends to address and clarify a specific section of the housing regulation regarding assessing penalties for the violation. It is further the intent of the Mayor and Council to update and clarify the penalties for the violation so as to allow a grace period after notice of violation for the owner, occupant and resident time to cure said violation and upon failure to do so establish a graduating fine amounts to be assessed as penalties to discourage habitual violations.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have become aware of health, safety and welfare concerns that exist with regards to the abuse of unlawful apartments and their use in the Borough, and this amended is being introduced to promote the compliance and deter the use of unlawful apartment in dwellings being used in violation of the zoning Code of the Borough and in furtherance of the health, safety and welfare concerns of the residents of the Borough of Elmwood Park; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have acknowledged and determined that the utilization of unlawful apartment have reached a level concerns and have become an hazard to the health, safety and the welfare of the public; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter XI of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park entitled "Housing" more specifically section 11-4.14 entitled "Penalty for Violation" more specifically part a. is hereby amended and replaced by the following language:

- a. Upon determination that a violation exists:
 - 1. Whereupon there is a determination that a violation exists the owner, landlord, tenant and or occupant shall be served with a notice of said violation which shall provide a 30-day period in which the owner, landlord, tenant or occupant shall be afforded the opportunity to cure or abate the condition and shall also be afforded an opportunity for a hearing before a court of competent jurisdiction for an independent determination concerning the violation.
 - 2. If a court has not determined otherwise or, upon reinspection of the property, it is determined that the abatement has not been substantially completed.
 - a. Whereupon there is a determination that the court finds that a violation exists, upon such findings and determination, the court shall impose one or more of the following for each and every violation hereof: Subsequent to the expiration of the 30-day period and or subsequent to the afforded opportunity for a hearing before a court of competent jurisdiction and the determination thereof, a fine shall be imposed and shall be assessed by a court of competent jurisdiction
 - 1. For the first offense there shall be assessed a fine of a minimum of \$1.500.00.
 - 2. For the second violation and offense there shall be a minimum sum of \$2,000.00.
 - 3. For a third violation and offense there shall be assessed a fine of not less than \$2,500.00
 - 4. For any and all subsequent violation the court can impose a term of imprisonment not to exceed 90 days and/or
 - 5. A period of community service not exceeding 90 days.
 - b. Each day in which the owner, landlord, tenant and/or occupant violates a provision of this section it shall be deemed a separate offense.

SECTION 2. In the event any section, part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance, or any remaining part of this Ordinance other than the part held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE UNDERTAKING OF THE DESIGN AND ENGINEERING PHASES FOR TRAFFIC SIGNALIZATION IMPROVEMENTS AT THE RIVER ROAD/RIVER DRIVE INTERSECTION IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$110,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO THE **AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE OF BONDS** TO **FINANCE** APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH **BONDS.**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake the design and engineering phases for traffic signalization improvements at the River Road/River Drive intersection in, by and for said Borough. Said improvement shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. The sum of \$110,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvement described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvement shall be made as a general improvement and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvement is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$110,000, and (4) \$5,300 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$104,700, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$110,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$5,300, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$5,300 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$104,700 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$104,700 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$104,700 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvement described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy <u>ad valorem</u> taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE III OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK TITLED "DEPARTMENT OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT "CHAPTER 2 "ADMINISTRATION" SECTION 2-27 ENTITLED "POLICE DEPARTMENT." MORE SPECIFICALLY SECTION 2-27.1 ENTITLED "CREATION OF THE DEPARTMENT; MEMBERS" CREATING THE POSITION OF CHAPLAIN FOR THE ELMWOOD PARK POLICE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the governing body of any municipality, by ordinance, may provide for the appointment of one or more chaplains to the police department or force pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-141; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined that a presence of a chaplain(s) position(s) in the Police Department would be a great help and assistance to the members of the Police Department, and by doing so would provide a moral and invaluable service to the police department in assisting to make the same more efficient in its operation and to protect the health and safety of the residents of the Borough of Elmwood Park.

NOW THERERFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 2, Article III of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park titled "Department of Local Government" more specifically section 2-27.1 Creation of the Department; Members, shall be amended to so as to add the following language and the following.

Section a. Shall be amended to reflect a new subsection 5 which shall read as follows:

5. There shall be created the position of Police Chaplain(s)

New Section 2-27.27 shall be inserted to read as follows:

2-27.27 Creation of position; statutory authority; qualifications; duties; term.

- A. The position of Police Chaplain for the Borough of Elmwood Park is hereby created in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:14-141. The position will be a volunteer position. The position of Police Chaplain shall be subject to the control of the Chief of Police.
- B. The Chief of Police shall recommend to the Borough Administrator person(s) that he/she believes meets the qualifications of N.J.S.A. 40A:14-141 as well as the rules and regulations of the Borough of Elmwood Park Police Department with reference to chaplains, if any. All applicants for the position of Chaplain shall be reviewed by the Chief of Police and Borough Administrator to determine that his/her qualifications are in accordance with this article and shall make recommendations to the Mayor and Council. The Mayor and Council shall appoint Chaplains in accordance with this article.
- C. Any person appointed as Chaplain shall be an ordained clergyman in good standing in the religious body from which he/she is selected. The Chaplain shall be a certified Police Chaplain credentialed in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Borough of Elmwood Park Police Department and shall be qualified in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:14-141.
- D. The duties of the Police Chaplain shall include, but not be limited to, assisting the Borough of Elmwood Park Police Department and all other Elmwood Park emergency service organizations in any duties that may be assigned by the Chief of Police that pertain to the Police Chaplaincy.
- E. Any person appointed as Chaplain shall serve in that capacity without rank or salary. The position will be a volunteer position.

F. A person appointed as Chaplain shall serve from the date of appointment and shall continue in that capacity for a period of one year or until such time as reappointed or a replacement is appointed, the initial period shall be from the first date of appointment till December 31 of the year of appointment, and every year thereafter until termination, resignation, or retirement from the position. The Chief of Police shall be notified and consulted should any of these options be exercised.

SECTION 2: Remaining Part Unchanged. All of the remaining parts of the Ordinance relating to Article III, known as Department of the Local Government of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that they are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3: Invalid Provisions. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication thereof as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, NEW JERSEY AMENDING THE BOROUGH CODE AND ALL GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH; MORE SPECIFICALLY, CHAPTER 4, LICENSING AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS, SECTION 4.7 (CLARIFYING APPLICATION FEES AND LICENSE FEES; CLARIFYING TYPES AND NUMBERS OF LICENSES THAT MAY BE ISSUED); CHAPTER 8, MARIJUANA DISPENSARIES AND PARAPHERNALIA; CHAPTER 34, ZONING SITE PLAN REVIEW, SECTION 34-3.1, SECTION 34-7.3, SECTION 34-7.4, SECTION 34-31, SECTION 34-44.1 AND SECTION 34-44.2 TO PERMIT AND GOVERN LEGAL CANNABIS AND MARIJUANA OPERATIONS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have become aware of certain clarifications that were necessary with Ordinance 21-13 and in an effort to address those concerns; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council find it necessary to amend Ordinance 21-13 in order to clarify said Ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 7, Chapter 4 of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park, entitled "Licensing and Business Regulations" is hereby amended, and specifically Ordinance 4-7.2, titled "Definitions", definition of "Cannabis Retailer" by deleting the existing section and replacing it with the following:

CANNABIS RETAILER: A State-regulated cannabis retailer that purchases or otherwise obtains usable cannabis and cannabis items from a cannabis cultivator, processors, wholesalers, or distributor and sells same to consumers from a retail establishment. Cannabis retailers may use a cannabis delivery service or a certified cannabis handler for off-premises delivery of cannabis products or items related to consumers. Cannabis Retailer shall possess prior to commencing operations a Class 5 license for retail sales of Cannabis from the State of New Jersey.

SECTION 1. Section 7, Chapter 4 of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park, entitled "Licensing and Business Regulations" is hereby amended, and specifically Ordinance 4-7.3, titled "Licensing", by deleting the existing section and replacing it with the following:

- a. Local Licensing Authority.
 - 1. The Borough "Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board" is hereby designated to act as the local agency to process and administer the licensing procedure for the Borough for all cannabis establishments. Upon completion of the review of the applications for licensing, a written report and recommendation shall be submitted to the Borough Council, who is and will be considered the licensing authority, as to the approval or denial of the particular license application. Under all circumstances in which State law requires communication to the Borough by the Cannabis Regulatory Commission or any other State agency with regard to the licensing of cannabis establishments by the State, or in which State law requires any review or approval by the Borough of any action taken by the State licensing authority, the exclusive authority for receiving such communications and granting such approvals shall be exercised by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park.
 - 2. Under no circumstances shall a local license for a cannabis establishment issued by the Borough Council be effective until or unless the State has issued the requisite permits or licenses to operate such a facility. It is the intent of this section that no cannabis establishment may lawfully operate in the Borough of Elmwood Park without the issuance of a State permit or license and full regulatory oversight of the cannabis establishment by the Cannabis Regulatory Commission or other states licensing authority as well as oversight and issuance of a license by the Borough.
- b. Classification of Licenses. The Borough, subject to land use approval and State licensure, may issue the following municipal licenses to operate a cannabis establishment:

- Class I: Cannabis Supplier License (Cultivators, Processors, Wholesalers, and Distributors) (Class 1-4 of State Statute)
- Class II: Cannabis Retailer license
- Class III: Cannabis Delivery Service License Cannabis delivery services are hereby prohibited from operating anywhere in the Borough of Elmwood Park, except for the delivery of cannabis items and related supplies by a licensed cannabis delivery service based and initiated from a cannabis delivery service licensed location outside of the Borough of Elmwood Park.
- c. Maximum Number of Licenses. The Borough may issue a total of eight (8)–Class I Cannabis Supplier licenses, however, no more than two (2) in each of the following Class I categories: Cultivators, Processors, Wholesalers, and Distributors; and a maximum of two (2) Class II Cannabis Retailer_license; and zero Class III Cannabis Delivery_Service licenses. Class III cannabis delivery services is hereby prohibited from operating anywhere in the Borough of Elmwood Park, except for the delivery of cannabis items and related supplies by a licensed cannabis delivery service based and initiated from a cannabis delivery service licensed location outside of the Borough of Elmwood Park. Licensure in all classes may be, but are not required to be, held by the same entity or individual, but an entity may not hold more than one cannabis retailer license. Any license conditionally issued by the Borough is contingent upon the locally licensed entities or individual's subsequent recipient of a State permit or license of the same class or type of regulated cannabis activity.
- d. Application. Persons wishing to obtain any classification of cannabis license shall file a license application with the Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board on a standardized form established by the Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board and approved by the Mayor and Council and available in the Borough Clerk's office. The Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board shall establish a reasonable application period and deadline for all applications. Except as specifically provided below, an application shall be deemed incomplete and shall not be processed by the Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board until all documents and application fees are submitted. To be deemed complete, all applications shall be accompanied by the following:
 - 1. The applicant shall submit proof that the applicant has or will have lawful possession of the premises proposed for the cannabis establishment, which proof may consist of:
 - (a) A deed, a lease, a real estate contract contingent upon successful licensing, or a binding letter of intent by the owner of the premises indicating an intent to lease the premises to the entrant contingent upon successful licensing.
 - 2. The applicant shall submit an affidavit and documentary proof of compliance with all state and local laws regarding affirmative action, anti-discrimination, and fair employment practices. The applicant shall also certify under oath that they will not and shall not discriminate based on race, color, religion (creed), gender, gender expression, age, national origin (ancestry), disability, marital status, sexual orientation, or military status, in any of its activities or operations.
 - 3. The location proposed for licensing by the applicant shall comply with all applicable municipal zoning laws and the location restrictions set forth in this Code.
 - 4. The applicant shall submit to the satisfaction of the Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board proof of financial capability to open and operate the marijuana establishment for which the applicant is seeking a license. Standards for proof of financial capability shall be determined by the Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board and approved by the Borough Council.
 - 5. The applicant shall submit all required nonrefundable fees for the application for conditional license in accordance with the following fee schedule:
 - (a) Class I: \$500.00 Cannabis Supplier license (Cultivators, Processors, Wholesalers, and Distributors)
 - (b) Class II: \$500 Cannabis Retailer license.

- 6. Within ten (10) business days of the Borough's notification to Applicant of award of conditional municipal license, the applicant shall submit all annual registration fees required in accordance with the following fee schedule, which shall be refunded in the event the applicant does not receive a license from the State of New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission:
 - (a) Class I: \$40,000 per year Cannabis Supplier License (Cultivators, Processors, Wholesalers, and Distributors).
 - (b) Class II: \$20,000 per year Cannabis Retailer License.
- 7. In addition to complying with any State requirement related to good character and criminal background, any person proposed to have an ownership interest in the license shall not have had any cannabis license or permit revoked for a violation affecting public safety in the State of New Jersey or a subdivision thereof within the preceding five (5) years.
- 8. The applicant and the application shall otherwise comply with any and all qualification standards set forth in the State and Borough laws or regulations.
- 9. In the event there are multiple applicants for a license, the Administrator shall evaluate all applicants and issue a notification of award after consideration and evaluation of the following criteria:
 - (a) Applicant's owners' or principals' qualifications and experience operating in highly regulated industries, including cannabis, healthcare, pharmaceutical manufacturing, and retail pharmacies, with preference to experience operating such businesses within the State of New Jersey and where the value of owners' experience shall outweigh the experience of non-owner principals (20%, not to exceed 2,500 words);
 - (b) Applicant's qualifications and experience related to public safety and security, including any of the applicant's owners' or principals' experience in law enforcement and drug enforcement (5%, not to exceed 1,000 words), and a summary of the applicant's plans for storage of products and currency, physical security, video surveillance, security personnel, and visitor management (5%, not to exceed 2,500 words);
 - (c) Applicant's or its owners' experience conducting or supporting or plans to conduct institutional review board ("IRB")- approved research involving human subjects that are related to medical cannabis or substance abuse, where the value of past or ongoing clinical research with IRB approval shall outweigh plans to conduct such research (5%, not to exceed 2,500 words), whether the applicant has had any assurance accepted by the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services indicating the applicant's commitment to complying with 45 CFR Part 46 (5%), and whether the applicant has a research collaboration or partnership agreement in effect with an accredited U.S. school of medicine or osteopathic medicine with experience conducting cannabis-related research (5%);
 - (d) Applicant's or its owners' demonstrated commitment or sufficient experience as responsible employers, defined as the applicant entity being a party to a labor peace agreement or the applicant entity or its parent company being a party to a collective bargaining agreement in the regulated cannabis industry for at least one year prior to application for a cannabis establishment license, in an effort to create well-paying jobs with employee benefits in the municipality (20% in total; five points for labor peace, full 20 points for collective bargaining agreement in effect for at least one year);

- (e) Summary of the applicant's environmental impact and sustainability plan (4%, not to exceed 500 words); whether the applicant entity or its parent company has any recognitions from or registrations with federal or New Jersey state environmental regulators for innovation in sustainability (3%), and whether the applicant entity or its parent company holds any certification under international standards demonstrating the applicant has an effective environmental management system or has a designated sustainability officer to conduct internal audits to assess the effective implementation of an environmental management system (3%);
- (f) Applicant's ties to the host community, demonstrated by at least one shareholder's proof of residency in Elmwood Park for five or more years in the past 10 years or at least one shareholder's continuous ownership of a business based in Elmwood Park for five or more years in the past 10 years (5%); and
- (g) Applicant's demonstrated commitment to diversity in its ownership composition and hiring practices and whether the applicant entity or its parent company holds any certifications as an NJ minority-owned, women-owned, or veteranowned business (20% in total; 10 points for one certification and 20% for two or more).
- 10. Notwithstanding the foregoing competitive application process, a notification of award and conditional municipal license shall entitle the recipient applicant to pursue a State permit or license in the appropriate classification for up to 12 months, which may be extended in the Borough Council's discretion for an additional six months for good cause. No license to operate shall issue until the applicant has received a State permit and satisfied other prerequisites of municipal licensure. If the recipient of a notice of award and conditional license has not received a State permit or license within 12 months from issuance, unless extended for good cause, the Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board shall issue a new request for applications and re-evaluate all applicants for licensure under the above criteria.

SECTION I. Section 7, Chapter 4 continued:

- e. Term of license and license renewals.
 - 1. Any local license issued pursuant to this section shall be valid for a period of three years from the date of issuance and shall be renewed in accordance with the provisions of this section.
 - 2. The Borough Council may, at their discretion, adjust the renewal date of the local license to correlate with an applicant's State licensing and renewal schedule.
 - 3. Renewal of any license shall be governed by any code amendments, additional restrictions, or changes in regulations adopted since the previous license was issued or renewed.
 - 4. Transfer of ownership of any local license or change of location of any license or modification to expand a licensed premise shall be subject to Borough planning review and zoning approval.
 - 5. Except where the Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board has received a complete renewal application along with the requisite fees and has forwarded its report and recommendation to the Borough Council for action, shall a license renewal be issued. It shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture, sell, distribute, transfer, transport, or otherwise remove cannabis or cannabis products from the premises of any license after the expiration date recorded on the face of the license.
- f. Disciplinary Actions; Sanctions; Penalties.
 - 1. Disciplinary Actions. Procedures for investigation of license violations and suspension, revocation, or other licensing sanctions as a result of any such violation shall be as follows:
 - (a) First offense: Up to \$250 per violation per day;
 - (b) Second offense: Up to \$500 per violation per day;
 - (c) Third violation shall result in summary suspension.

- 2. Summary Suspension. Notwithstanding the foregoing section, when the Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board has reasonable grounds to believe that a licensee has engaged in deliberate and willful violation of any applicable law or regulation, or that the public health, safety, and/or general welfare has been jeopardized and requires emergency action, same shall be reported to the Borough Council with recommendation for appropriate action and the Borough Council may enter a summary suspension order for the immediate suspension of such license pending further investigation.
 - (a) The summary suspension order shall be in writing and shall state the reasons, therefore. The licensee shall be afforded an opportunity for a hearing as outlined herein
 - (b) The Borough Council shall convene a review panel consisting of a Council member, a second hearing officer designated by the Mayor, and the Chief of Police and the Borough Attorney as legal counsel. The hearing shall be scheduled within 30 days of the date of the order.
 - (c) The review panel is authorized to impose any fines, conditions, restrictions, suspensions, or combination thereof authorized by the State of New Jersey. In the absence of State specified penalties, the Borough may issue fines up to, but not to exceed, \$2,500 per offense and/or suspension of license for a period not to exceed six months.

g. Inactive Licenses.

1. Following the commencement of retail sales of cannabis or cannabis products, the Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board may recommend to the Borough Council to suspend or revoke any license if the licensed premises have been inactive or unoccupied by the licensee for at least six months.

h. State License.

1. The Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board may recommend to the Borough Council that the Borough Council may suspend or revoke any license if the corresponding State license or permit for the subject location is expired, surrendered, suspended, or revoked.

i. Cannabis Tax.

- 1. Transfer Tax. Pursuant to section 40 of the Act, N.J.S.A. 40:48I-1a(1), the following transfer taxes are hereby established on all cannabis establishments operating within the Township as the maximum amount as permitted by the laws of the State of New Jersey or the amounts set forth below, whichever is greater:
 - (a) 2% on the gross receipts from each sale of all cannabis and cannabis items by any cannabis cultivator to any other cannabis cultivator;
 - (b) 2% on the gross receipts from each sale by a cannabis manufacturer;
 - (c) 1% on the gross receipts from each sale by a cannabis wholesaler; and
 - (d) 2% on the gross receipts from each sale of cannabis and/or cannabis items from any cannabis establishment to another cannabis establishment.
- 2. User Tax. Pursuant to section 40 of the Act, N.J.S.A. 40:48I-1a(2), the following user taxes are hereby established on all concurrent license holders operating within the Township, which shall be in addition to any other tax imposed by law as the maximum amount as permitted by the laws of the State of New Jersey or the amounts set forth below, whichever is greater:
 - (a) 2% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis cultivator;
 - (b) 2% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis manufacturer;
 - (c) 1% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis wholesaler; and
 - (d) 2% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis retailer.
- 3. Medical Cannabis. The above provisions as to the user and transfer taxation of any cannabis marketplace activities shall not apply to that portion of any business activities conducted by a concurrent licensee with respect to medical cannabis cultivation, medical cannabis manufacturing, medical cannabis processing, medical cannabis distribution and/or the dispensing of medical cannabis items only. Such user and transfer taxation amounts for medical cannabis activities shall be governed by a contractual agreement with the licensed medical cannabis facility.

- 4. Monthly Statement. Each cannabis entity shall send a statement by mail or electronically to the Borough of Elmwood Park on or before the last day of each calendar month or such other term as required by the State. The statement must contain an account of the amount of cannabis produced, processed, cultivated, and/or sold or transferred to distributors, retail cannabis stores, and/or cannabis product manufacturing facilities in the State during the preceding month, setting out:
 - (a) The total number of ounces, including fractional ounces sold or transferred;
 - (b) The names and New Jersey address of each buyer and transferee;
 - (c) The weight of cannabis sold or transferred to the respective buyers or transferees; and
 - (d) Such other information as may be necessary for the Borough to determine and verify the tax or fee due to the Borough.
- 5. Payment of Taxes. The cannabis facility and/or establishment shall pay the above referenced taxes on a quarterly basis, or at such term set by the State, to the Borough of Elmwood Park. Payments of all user and transfer taxes, shall be computed at the rates prescribed in this section on the respective total quantities of the cannabis sold or transferred during the preceding quarter. All user and transfer taxes shall be paid within 30 days of the preceding quarterly period.
- 6. Administration and Enforcement of Tax.
 - (a) Failure to make timely payments under this section shall be subject to the interest rate imposed shall be the same as that imposed by the Borough for unpaid realty property taxes and shall be collectable in the same manner as unpaid property taxes.
 - (b) In addition to the above, in the event that a cannabis facility and/or establishment fails to pay the tax to the Borough of Elmwood Park, the cannabis facility's issued local license shall be subject to revocation and non-renewal.

SECTION 1, Chapter 8 of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park, entitled "**Definition of Terms**" is hereby amended, and specifically the definition of "Cannabis Retailer" by deleting the existing section and replacing it with the following:

CANNABIS RETAILER. A State-regulated cannabis retailer that purchases or otherwise obtains usable cannabis and cannabis items from a cannabis cultivator, processors, wholesalers, or distributor and sells same to consumers from a retail establishment. Cannabis retailers may use a cannabis delivery service or a certified cannabis handler for off-premises delivery of cannabis products or items related to consumers. Cannabis Retailer shall possess prior to commencing operations a Class 5 license for retail sales of Cannabis from the State of New Jersey.

SECTION 3.1, Chapter 34 of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park, entitled "**Zoning and Site Plan Review**" is hereby amended, and specifically Ordinance 34-3.1, titled "Definitions" by deleting the existing section and replacing it with the following:

CANNABIS RETAILER: A State-regulated cannabis retailer that purchases or otherwise obtains usable cannabis and cannabis items from a cannabis cultivator, processors, wholesalers, or distributor and sells same to consumers from a retail establishment. Cannabis retailers may use a cannabis delivery service or a certified cannabis handler for off-premises delivery of cannabis products or items related to consumers. A Cannabis Retailer shall possess prior to commencing operations a Class 5 license for retail sales of Cannabis from the State of New Jersey.

SECTION 2. If any part of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed or amended to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be a part of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park as though codified and fully set forth therein. The Borough Clerk shall have this ordinance codified and incorporated in the official copies of the Code.

The Borough Clerk and the Borough Attorney are authorized and directed to change any Chapter, Article and/or Section number of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park in the event that the codification of this Ordinance reveals that there is a conflict between the numbers and the existing Code, and in order to avoid confusion and possible accidental Repealer of existing provisions not intended to be repealed.

BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK BERGEN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY ORDINANCE # 22-05

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, CHAPTER III, ENTITLED "POLICE REGULATIONS," MORE SPECIFICALLY SECTION 3-19 ENTITLED "TATTOOING" SAME TO BE REPEALED AND REPLACED BY THE FOLLOWING CONTAINED HEREIN IN ORDER TO REGULATE TATTOOING AND BODY PIERCING IN THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK

INTENT OF THIS ORDINANCE

This Ordinance is intended to address Tattooing and Body Piercing in the Borough and repeal the present prohibition of such activity and allow the same to be permitted and regulated.

WHEREAS, the Elmwood Park Department of Health and Human Services, having general jurisdiction under N.J.S.A. 26: 32-8, to adopt health ordinances for the control of disease and the improvement of the health of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 26: 3-64 and N.J.S.A. 26: IA-9 authorizes the Health Department to regulate tattoo parlors, tattooists, and body piercers within the geographical boundaries of the Borough of Elmwood Park; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for the regulation of tattoo parlors, tattooists, and body piercers so as to establish standards of operation which serve to promote the public's health and welfare,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the mayor and council of the borough of Elmwood Park as follows:

Chapter 3-19, entitled "Tattooing," is hereby repealed in its entirety, and same shall be replaced, amended, and supplemented by the following:

SECTION 1: 3-19 TATTOOING AND BODY PIERCING

SECTION 2: 3-9.1 Definitions

"Health Officer" shall mean the Elmwood Park Borough Health Officer or his/her authorized representative.

"Certificate of Inspection" shall mean written approval from the health officer or his/her authorized representative that said tattooing or body piercing establishment has been inspected and meets all of the terms of this ordinance.

"Operator" shall mean any individual, firm, company, corporation, or association that owns or operates an establishment where tattooing or body piercing is performed and any individual who performs or practices the art of tattooing on the person of another.

"Tattoo," "tattooed, "or "tattooing" refers to any method of placing designs, letters, scrolls, figures, symbols, or any marks under the skin with ink or any other substance resulting in the coloration of the skin by the aid of needles or any other instruments designed to puncture the skin.

"Body piercing" refers to the piercing of any portion of the human body for placement of any type of jewelry or any other ornamentation other than ear lobe piercing.

"establishment" means the premises wherein tattooing or body piercing is performed.

"Tattoo artist" is one who engages in tattooing.

"Body piercer" is one who engages in body piercing

"Sanitize" means a bacterial treatment of cleaned surfaces by a process which is effective in reducing the number of microorganisms to a safe level.

"Sterilization" means the destruction of all forms of micro biotic life, including spores, through the use of a steam sterilizer or autoclave.

"Single-use" means products or items that are disposed of after use on each client, including, but not limited to, cotton swabs or balls, tissues or paper products, paper or plastic cups, gauze, and sanitary covering, razors, needles, scalpel blades, stencils and ink cups.

"Personal identification" shall mean a document or other written or memorialized instrument setting forth the presenter's true name, address, correct age, or other identifying data, examples of which include but are not limited to driver's license, a credit card issued by a national company, birth certificate, passport, employment identification card, or any instrument issued by a governmental agency setting forth the pertinent and required information.

SECTION 3: 3-19.2 Unlawful

a. It shall be unlawful for any operator to engage in the business of operating an establishment where tattooing or body piercing is performed without first obtaining a license from the Elmwood Park Health Department to engage in such business in accordance with the provisions hereof.

SECTION 4: 3-19.3 Licensing Regulations:

- a. Application for licenses under this Article shall be filed with the Elmwood Park Health Department, in writing, upon such printed forms as the Elmwood Park Health Department shall prescribe and prepare.
- b. The application forms may be obtained from the Elmwood Park Health Department and shall be signed by the applicant under oath and shall contain the following information:
 - 1. If an individual, the full name, age, sex, residence address at the time of application.
 - 2. If a corporation, the full corporate name, the date and the state of incorporation, address of the place or places of business, the name and address of the registered agent, and the name, address and age of any principal owning more than 10 per cent (10%) of the stock.
 - 3. If a partnership, the information required by Subsection 1 (a) above for each partner and the name under which the business is being conducted.
 - 4. The apprenticeship, training and/or business experience of the applicant in the business or occupation for which the license is sought.
 - 5. The length of time that the applicant has engaged in such business or occupation.
 - 6. Whether the applicant carries public liability insurance, and, if so, the amount of said coverage and the company providing such liability insurance.
 - 7. Name, address and age of every tattoo artist and/or body piercer to be initially employed to conduct the service. This shall be a continuing obligation for licenses to update once a year the list of tattoo artists and/or body piercers employed by the establishment.
 - 8. State the date upon which Construction Official has approved the location for business.
- c. no ownership rights in any license or renewal hereof granted under the provisions of this Article shall be assignable or transferable without the permission of the Health Department whose permission shall not be unreasonably withheld. Any change of ownership shall require a new application and license with payment of fees.

SECTION 5: 3-19.4 Licensing Fees

- a. An application for an initial license shall be filed with the Health Department of the Borough of Elmwood Park accompanied by a fee in the amount of Two hundred (\$200.00) dollars.
- b. The renewal license fee for engaging in the business of operating an establishment subject to this Ordinance within the Borough of Elmwood Park shall be One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars per year.

SECTION 6: 3-19.5 Expiration and Renewal of Licenses

- a. All licenses shall expire on the last day of each calendar year. The first license expiration date for renewal shall be December 31, 2021.
- b. All applications for renewal must be presented to the Health Department in writing on a form prescribed by the Health Department, within thirty (30) days prior to the end of the calendar year.
- c. Establishments failing to apply within the specified time period will be considered new applicants and will be subject to the provision of Subsection 3-19.3.

SECTION 7: 3-19.6 Renovations of tattoo and/or Boby Piercing Establishment

a. If renovations of the tattoo or body piercing establishment occur, plans must be submitted to the Elmwood Park Health Department and the applicant will be required to comply with all section herein, as well as all other applicable Building codes, regulations, local and state zoning laws and or any other applicable laws.

SECTION 8: 3-19.7 Failure to Qualify for License

a. In the event that an applicant fails to qualify for a license under this ordinance, the fee herein shall be non-refundable.

SECTION 9: 3-19.8 License Posting

a. The license issued pursuant to this section shall be posted conspicuously in the place of business or location named therein.

SECTION 10: 3-19.9 Managing Waste and Contaminated Materials

- a. All establishments shall manage contaminated (body fluids) contact waste materials as medical waste pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-A.8.
- b. All establishments shall be licensed with the State of New Jersey as a medical waste generator, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-A.8, prior to approval from the Elmwood Park Health Department.

SECTION 11: 3-19.10 General Provisions

- a. It shall be a violation of this Ordinance for anyone or any tattoo or body piercing business to tattoo or body pierce any individual under 18 years of age without authorization signed by the parent or legal guardian, witnessed and attested to by a notary public. The operator/owner or principal shall be responsible for maintaining the original consent form and copies of all consent information for a period of two (2) years beyond the recipient's eighteenth (18th) birthday. The operator shall obtain a copy of a two forms of personal identification of such individual being tattooed and/or pierced.
- Each person wishing to receive a tattoo or body piercing must first sign a consent form presented by the operator the content of which has been approved by the Elmwood Park Health Department. This form shall commence with the following statement: "1 swear, certify or affirm under the penalties of false swearing or perjury the following information. The consent form shall contain language above the applicant 's signature which shall read, "I have read and understand the contents of this form, and acknowledge that an operator of the above-named tattoo and/or body piercing establishment has reviewed the same with me. I have presented to the operator the following forms of identification which I represent, warrant and guarantee are truthful and correct and are identification that relates to me. I further represent that I am an adult over the age of 18, and am not currently intoxicated or under the influence of any narcotic substance, and make this statement entirely of my own free will and sound mind. " The form shall also include a signature line for the operator above which the following language shall appear: "I have reviewed the language of this form with the applicant who has represented to me that he/she fully understands the contents of same, and that the information provided is truthful, in addition, I have reviewed the documentation presented by the applicant with respect to his/her age . " If the applicant appears to be visibly intoxicated or disoriented, the operator must refuse the applicant.
- c. All records regarding tattoos or body piercing are to be maintained for a minimum of two (2) years. Information required for each applicant referred to in Section III, B. is to include the name, age, date of birth, health history including allergies and medical conditions, home address and telephone numbers of the applicant as well as the name of the person who did the tattoo or body piercing, the design, location and the date of the tattoo or type of body piercing done.

SECTION 12: 3-19.11 Sanitary Requirements, Design and Layout Specification

- a. Each tattoo or body piercing facility shall have a bathroom accessible to the public and staff, and a stainless-steel sink in a separately designated sterilization room which is to be used by staff only as required by paragraph __ of this section ___ . The sink in the sterilization room shall be connected to hot and cold running water. Each bathroom shall be equipped with a commode and a sink, with the sink being connected to hot and cold running water.
- b. Soap and sanitary towels, or other approved hand drying devices, shall be available at the sink in the bathroom (s) and sterilization room at all times.
- c. Common towels are prohibited. Employee Hand washing Signs shall be posted in each bathroom and sterilization room. There shall be no door requiring the use of a tattoo artist/body piercer's hand in going from a hand-washing area to a work area.
- d. The chair or seat reserved for the person receiving the tattoo or body piercing shall be a material that is smooth and easily cleanable and constructed of material that is non-absorbent. Any surface on the chair that becomes exposed to blood or body fluids must be cleaned and sanitized prior to use by the next customer.
- e. The work table or counter used by the tattoo artist or body piercer shall be smooth and easily cleanable and constructed of material that is non-absorbent. There shall be a non-permeable juncture between a table/counter and a wall if the table/ counter is to be placed against a wall. This table/ counter must be cleaned and sanitized (utilizing a method approved by the Elmwood Park Health Department) between customers.
- f. The tattooing or body piercing area walls shall be smooth and easily cleanable, and constructed of a non-absorbent material.
- g. The floor in the tattooing or body piercing area shall be of durable material that is non-absorbent, smooth, and easily cleanable. Floors shall be kept clean.
- h. Lighting within the tattoo or body piercing area shall be adequate so as to provide a minimum of 100-foot candles in all areas . Such illumination shall be reasonable free from glare and distributed to avoid shadows .
- i. Each establishment must contain at least one enclosed "privacy room" so as to protect the confidentiality of the applicant, and revelation of the service provided. The privacy room must be used when tattooing or body piercing is to be performed on either female breasts, or the buttocks or groin areas of males or females. The privacy room shall have a swinging type door for ingress and egress, and be separated from other areas of the establishment by either walls or durable partitions, or other materials able to be sanitized, extending at least six (6) feet in height and so designed to prevent visual observation of the customer and the tattoo artist from any other area by any persons other than the customer and the tattoo artist or body piercer.
- j. Any surfaces in the establishment that become exposed to blood or body fluids must be cleaned and sanitized, utilizing a method approved by the Elmwood Park Health Department.
- k. Cleaning, disinfection and sterilization activities must be conducted in a physically separate work area. This area should have a clearly defined work pattern from soiled to clean in order to prevent cross-contamination. All sterile equipment must be stored in enclosed cabinets outside of the processing room. All containers, regardless of size, must be clearly marked with the name of the product.
- 1. Proper waste receptacles shall be provided and waste shall be disposed of at appropriate intervals.
- m. The use of tobacco in any form in the establishment is prohibited.
- n. The consumption of food or drink shall be prohibited in the tattoo/body piercing work areas of the parlor.

- o. Only articles considered necessary for the routine and customary operation and maintenance of the tattoo/body piercing business shall be permitted in the tattoo or body piercing establishment.
- p. No live bird, turtle, snake, dog, cat, or another animal shall be permitted in any area used for the conduct of tattooing and/or body piercing operations or in the immediate open, adjacent areas, including the main waiting area and the public access to the toilet room, with the exception of animals utilized for the assistance of the blind and/or deaf.
- q. Adequate measures shall be taken to protect the entrance into the parlor and the breeding or presence on the premises of insects and rodents.
- r. Anyone using pesticides must be certified by the State of New Jersey for application of same.
- s. The use of pesticides shall not result in the contamination of dyes, inks, ink reservoirs, needles, jewelry or gloves, or any equipment used in connection with the operation.
- t. Proper ventilation and exhaust will be provided.

SECTION 13: 3-19.12 Regulation of Tattoo or Body Piercing Parlors:

- a. Tattoo Artist or Body Piercer/Operator Certificate:
 - (1) No person shall practice the art of tattooing or body piercing within the Borough of Elmwood Park without first obtaining a certificate from the Department.
 - (2) All certificates shall automatically expire on December 31 annually.
 - (3) No certificate to practice the art of tattooing or body piercing shall be issued unless:
 - (a) the applicant furnishes proof of having previously held such a certificate, or
 - the applicant provides proof of having practiced the art of tattooing or body piercing as a full-time occupation, which may take the form of a letter from a tattoo and/or body piercing establishment representing that the applicant is/was employed by the said establishment as a tattoo artist or body piercer, or that the applicant presently operates or had in the past operated a tattoo or body piercing establishment, or had in the past or currently maintains an ownership interest in a business, partnership or corporation which operates or operated a tattoo or body piercing establishment, and
 - (c) the applicant furnishes proof of having attended Bloodborne pathogen training which includes principles of disinfection and sterilization. Compliance with this paragraph will be waived for guest tattoo artists retained by the establishment so long as the customer upon whom the guest tattoo artist is to provide the service is provided with prior written notice that the guest tattoo artist has not attended bloodborne pathogen training, including principles of disinfection and sterilization, and
 - (d) Proof of Hepatitis B pre-exposure vaccination or proof of immunity is recommended for all tattoo artists or body piercers. Notwithstanding the foregoing, all tattoo artists or body piercers shall provide the Elmwood Park Health Department with one of the following: (1) Proof of Hepatitis B pre-exposure vaccination or proof of immunity, or (2) A letter or statement from a physician certifying that the individual does not have Hepatitis B and the vaccination is contraindicated, or (3) A written statement or letter signed by the tattoo artist or body piercer declining to provide the information sought in the immediately preceding subsections (1) or (2).

- (4.) The operator shall develop operating guidelines, in accordance with the C.D.C. and O.S.H.A., that will reduce the likelihood of accidental needle sticks and establish a monitoring system for those person(s) accidentally stuck by a needle. The guidelines shall be submitted to the Elmwood Park Health Department for approval before the issuance of a license and subsequent renewals of the license, and
 - a. the applicant pays the initial and annual certificate fee of \$25.00 (twenty-five dollars).
- (5.) Each application for a certificate shall set forth:
 - a. the name and address of the applicant;
 - b. a physical description of the premises where tattooing/ body piercing is to be done:
 - c. such other information as the Department may require.
 - d. Certificates shall be issued unless the Elmwood Park Health Department demonstrates that the tattoo/body piercing operator has failed to comply with the provisions of this Section after being afforded a reasonable opportunity to cure any deficiencies found in its application.
 - e. All certificates shall be conditioned upon continued compliance with the provisions of this Section as well as other applicable provisions.
 - f. The certificate shall be posted in a prominent and conspicuous area where it may be readily observed by patrons.
- (6.) The operator of a tattoo/body piercing establishment shall submit a written aftercare plan to the Elmwood Park Health Department. Body piercing establishments will submit an aftercare plan specific to each body site intended to pierce.
- (7.) Before working on each patron, each tattoo artist or body piercer shall scrub and wash his/her hands thoroughly with hot water and antiseptic soap. Fingernails shall be kept clean and short.
- (8.) Disposable vinyl or latex gloves shall be worn by the tattoo artist or body piercer during tattoo preparation and application to prevent contact with blood or body fluids. Universal precautions described by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (C.D.C.) shall be followed. All materials shall be disposed of following all of the respective sections of this Ordinance as well as all required health rules and regulation covering the policy of this section after contact with each patron. Hands shall be washed immediately after the removal of gloves. Any skin surface that has contact with blood shall be cleaned immediately.
- (9.) Immediately after tattooing or body piercing a patron, the tattooist or body piercer shall advise the patron on the care of the tattoo or body piercing in a written form and shall instruct the patron to consult a physician at the first sign of infection of the tattoo or body piercing. Printed instructions regarding these points shall be given to each patron.
- (10.) All medically diagnosed infections resulting from the practice of tattooing or body piercing which become known to the operator shall be promptly reported to the Health Officer by the person owning or operating the tattoo or body piercing establishment or by the tattoo artist or body piercer within 24 hours.

SECTION 14: 3-19.13 Employee Health

- a. The establishment shall comply with all the current O.S.H.A. requirements applicable to its operation.
- b. No person affected with infected wounds, open and infected sores, and acute respiratory infection shall work in any area of a tattoo or body piercing establishment in any capacity in which there is a likelihood of contaminating tattoo or body piercing equipment, supplies, or work surfaces.

SECTION 15: 3-19.14 Skin Preparation

- a. Tattooing or body piercing shall be done only on a normal, healthy skin surface free of moles or infection.
- b. Only safety razors with disposable blades shall be used for skin preparation. Blades shall be disposed of according to Section_____ of this Ordinance after each use, and new blades shall be used for each patron.
- c. Following shaving, the area shall be thoroughly cleaned and scrubbed with a tincture of green soap or its equivalent and warm water. Before placing the design or body piercing on the patron's skin, the area shall be treated with 70% alcohol and allowed to air dry.
- d. Piercing mucous membranes (i.e., oral, nasal, vaginal, etc.) shall be treated with an industry-appropriate and medically indicated antiseptic solution before the procedure.
- e. Only petroleum jelly (U.S.A. or National Formulary) or antiseptic ointment shall be applied to the tattoo area before tattooing or body piercing. The ointment shall be applied in a sanitary manner, disposing of the utensil after spreading. Collapsible tubes of ointment or jelly may also be used.

SECTION 16: 3-19.15 Tattooing or Body Piercing

- a. The use of single service hectographed stencils shall be required for applying a tattoo outline to the skin. Multi-use stencils shall be prohibited.
- b. Only non-toxic dyes or pigments may be used. Pre-mixed sterile materials are preferred. Pre-mixed dyes shall be used without adulteration of the manufacturer's original formula. The Operator shall represent to the Elmwood Park Health Department, at the time of license application and renewal, that to the best of his/her knowledge, the dyes and pigments used in tattoo applications are of non-toxic origins and shall submit supporting documentation on same. The operator shall also present to the Elmwood Park Health Department labels or manufacturer's data sheets relating to dyes and pigments or such other written documentation as is applicable to the dyes and pigments that are non-toxic or non-hazardous to human health.
- c. Single service or individual containers of dye or ink shall be used for each patron, and the container disposed of immediately after completing work on each patron.
- d. The completed tattoo shall be washed with sterile gauze or single-use paper tissue, and a solution of tincture of green soap or its equivalent, then disinfected with 70% alcohol. The area shall be allowed to air dry and antiseptic ointment shall be applied and spread with sterile gauze and sterile dressing attached.
- e. Upon completion of piercing or the mucous membranes, the area shall be disinfected with the industry-appropriate and medically indicated solution

SECTION 17: 3-19.17 Needles, Instruments and Dyes

- a. Only single service sterilized needles and needle bars shall be used for each patron.
- b. If solder is used in manufacturing needles, needle bars or needle tubes, it must be free of lead.
- c. Any needle that penetrates the skin of the tattoo artist or body piercer shall be immediately disposed of in accordance with Section V5 of this Ordinance .
- d. Needle tubes shall be ultrasonically cleaned in a solution which is alcohol or its equivalent, then scrubbed with a clean brush, then rinsed clean. Needle tubes shall be sterilized in accordance with Section V.4E, stored in sterile bags and maintained in a dry, closed area.
- e. Each item to be sterilized shall be individually wrapped using chemical indicator bags or chemical indicator strips. Sterilization shall be by steam sterilization / autoclave. The autoclave shall be well maintained with a tight fitting gasket and clean interior. The manufacturer's operating instructions and sterilization specifications shall be at hand. The sterilizer shall conform to the manufacturer's specifications with regard to temperature, pressure and time of sterilization cycle. Proper functioning of sterilization cycles shall be verified by the monthly use of biologic indicators (i.e., spore tests). A record of these monthly test results shall be available, and a test may be required to be done during any inspections. Establishments are required to maintain an autoclave on site, with a minimum interior chamber that is no less than 7" in diameter and 15" in depth.
- f. If the primary source of sterilization malfunctions, the Elmwood Park Health Department shall be notified no later than 4 hours after the deficiency. In an emergent situation, the Elmwood Park Health Department may approve alternate sterilization techniques.
- g. Needles and bars shall not be bent or broken prior to disposal. Tattoo artists or body piercers shall take precautions to prevent injuries from contaminated needles or tubes.

- h. All dyes and inks shall be from a source of supply which complies with applicable U.S. Food and Drug Administration regulations when available. Dyes and inks are to be used in accordance with the manufacturer's directions and are not to be adulterated with any substance not recommended by the manufacturer.
- i. Immediately before applying a tattoo, the quantity of dye to be used for the tattoo shall be transferred from the dye bottles and placed into sterile, single-use paper cups or plastic caps. Upon completion of the tattoo, these single use cups or Caps and their contents shall be discarded.
- j. Excess dye or ink shall be removed from the skin with a single service wiping tissue or sterile gauze which shall be discarded after each use.

SECTION 2: 3-19.18 Disposal of Waste

a. All used needles, needle bars or other disposable tools used in the tattooing process, as well as gloves, gauze and other materials saturated with blood or body fluids, shall be removed through the use of a licensed medical waste hauler.

SECTION 17: 3-19.18 Prohibitions

- a. No tattoo studio or body piercing studio shall be permitted within five hundred feet (500') of any school, park or house of worship, and no closer than five hundred feet (500') to other tattoo studio or body piercing studio or adult entertainment location should any exist.
- b. To the extent that a tattoo studio or body piercing studio shall constitute a commercial use, the same shall be permitted only in the Local Commerce Cl and General Commerce CG and only upon and after site plan review pursuant to the Land Use Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park Use as Permitted by zoning ordinance.
- c. Temporary Tattoo/Body Piercing establishments are prohibited.

SECTION 18: 3-19.19 Penalty Provisions:

- a. Any person or entity who or which violates any section of this ordinance shall be subject to the following penalty: A fine not to exceed \$1,000.00; imprisonment not to exceed 90 days in the county jail; community service not to exceed 90 days or any combination thereof in the discretion of the Municipal Court Judge. Each day that the violation exists is considered to be a separate offense.
- b. After due notice and hearing, the Health Department may suspend or revoke any license issued under this Ordinance for violation of the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 19: 3-19.20 Inconsistency

a. Any Ordinance or parts of an Ordinance inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 20: 3-19.21 Invalidity

a. Each section of this Ordinance and every subsection hereof shall be deemed independent, separate and distinct from all other sections, and the holding of any section or a part thereof to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause shall not be deemed to affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section or part thereof.

SECTION 21: 3-19.22 Effective Date

Adopted: March 17, 2022

a. The Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage publication according to law.

CALENDAR YEAR 2022 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.50% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park in the County of Bergen finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$215,221 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Elmwood Park shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$753,275 and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the Borough of Elmwood Park be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.
