#### **SECTION IV: LONGEVITY**

1. A full-time employee shall be entitled to longevity pay based in the following schedule:

Completion of the third year to completion of the fifth year	1%
Beginning of the sixth year to the completion of the eighth year	2%
Beginning of the ninth year to the completion of the eleventh year	3%
Beginning of the twelfth year to the completion of the fourteenth year	4%
Beginning of the fifteenth year to the completion of the twentieth year	5%
Beginning of the twenty-first year to the completion of the twenty-fourth year	6%
Beginning of the twenty-fifth year	8%

2. Any employee hired after January 1, 2007 shall not be entitled to longevity.
3. Such payments shall be added to each employee's base annual salary.

**SECTION V: SICK LEAVE**

1. All full-time employees shall be compensated annually for up to (15) days absence from work by reason of illness. All sick leave shall be accumulated and any unused portion thereof shall be applied towards future illness.

**SECTION VI: HOLIDAY & PERSONAL DAYS**

1. All Borough employees for who there is provided herein an annual compensation shall be excused from the performance of their duties with continuance of pay on the following days:

2. \*Floater Holiday
3. In the event that a holiday falls on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be observed as the holiday. In the event that a holiday falls on a Saturday, the preceding Friday shall be observed as the holiday.
4. This section shall not apply to part time employees whom are compensated on an hourly basis.

**SECTION VII: VACATION**

1. All full-time employees shall be allowed vacation leave from their employment with continuance of compensation provided herein, in accordance with the following schedule:

One through five years of service	12 days
Completion of the fifth year to ten years of service	12 days plus one day per year for each up to 17 days
Completion of ten years of service	21 days
Completion of twelve years of service	22 days
Completion of fourteen years of service	23 days
Completion of sixteen years of service	24 days
Completion of eighteen years of service	25 days
completion of twenty years of service and thereafter	30 days

2. All employees hired after January 1, 2007 cannot accumulate vacation days other than accrued days from (1) year prior.

**SECTION VIII: TERMINAL LEAVE**

1. All employees hired prior to January 1, 1991 that desire to enter into retirement shall receive terminal leave immediately prior to said retirement provided said employee notified the Borough prior to February 15<sup>th</sup> of the year he/she intends to retire. PERS will then be notified and the retirement application of the employee will be processed. Such leaves shall be computed at the following rate:

1 to 7 years	1 month
8 to 14 years	2 months
15 to 21 years	3 months
22 years and over	4 months

2. In addition to leave granted above, each employee shall receive enumeration for ½ of all accumulated sick days from January 1, 1962 immediately prior to retirement of such employee with a maximum accumulation of 120 working days.

3. All employees hired on or after January 1, 1991, shall receive the following terminal leave:

After 10 years of service	1 month
After 20 years of service	2 months

4. Each employee shall receive his terminal leave payment as a lump sum payment as of the last day of the performance of duty before commencement of his terminal leave.

**SECTION IX: SICK/VACATION DAYS FOR FULL TIME CROSSING GUARDS**

1. All full time crossing guards shall receive 10 sick/vacation days per school year, September through June. At the end of the school year, all full time crossing guards will receive an additional pay of \$25.00 per day for each sick/vacation day not used during the school year.

**SECTION X: REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES**

1. All prior Department Head, Non-Union and Part Time Salary Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.



**BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK  
ORDINANCE 14-27**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER VII OF THE CODE OF THE  
BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK TITLED "TRAFFIC".**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION 1:** Chapter VII of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park titled "Traffic" is hereby amended by deleting the existing Section 7-8.3 titled "Temporary Parking Prohibition for Snow Plowing and Removal," and replacing it with the following:

**§7-8.3 – Temporary Parking Prohibition for Snow Plowing and Removal.**

a. Whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that it covers the street or highway, an emergency shall exist during the snow fall and for a period of 24 hours following the end of the snow fall and this Ordinance shall supersede all parking Ordinances in the Borough of Elmwood Park.

b. In the Rosemont Section and no vehicles shall be parked on the following streets or highways or portions thereof listed below from 6p.m to 9 a.m except those streets otherwise designated 9 a.m-6.p.m. (The Rosemont Section shall mean the following streets: Florence Place, Bellevue Avenue, Rosedale Avenue, Orange Avenue and Rosemont.) Between Broadway and Magnolia.

c. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation of this subsection shall be deemed a nuisance and a menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any Police Officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of the removal and storage which may result from such removal before regaining possession of the vehicle.

d. The effectiveness of this subsection is contingent upon signs being erected as required by law.

e. Unless some penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation of this subsection or any supplement thereto, shall be liable to a penalty of a minimum of fifty \$50 dollars but not more than two hundred (\$200.00) dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days or both.

ORDINANCE 14-28**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER IV OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK ENTITLED "WRECKERS AND TOW TRUCKS."**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 4-34 of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park entitled "Wreckers and Tow Trucks" is hereby amended by deleting the existing Section 4-34 and replacing it with the following

**4-34 WRECKERS AND TOW TRUCKS.\***

**4-34.1 Definitions.**

As used in this section, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

*Cruising* shall mean the operation of an unengaged wrecker along the public streets in any fashion intended likely or calculated to solicit business.

*Owner* shall mean a person, firm or corporation who owns and/or operates a vehicle on the roads and highways within the Borough of Elmwood Park, which vehicle, by reason of being disabled or being unlawfully upon said roads, requires towing services.

*Towing operator* shall mean a person, firm or corporation engaged in the business of providing wrecker services and storage services for vehicles towed, which services are made available to the general public upon such rates, charges and fees as determined by said person, firm or corporation and who is licensed under the provisions of this section.

*Wrecker* shall mean a vehicle driven by mechanical power and employed for the purpose of towing, transporting, conveying or removing any and all kinds of vehicles or parts of vehicles which are unable to be operated under their own power, for which a service charge or fee is exacted.

(Ord. No. 06-34)

**4-34.2 License Required; Fees; Expiration.**

a. *License Required.* No towing operator shall operate within the Borough of Elmwood Park without obtaining a license in accordance with the provisions of this section. Specifically exempted are towing operators which are directly and privately engaged or designated by the owner of the vehicle towed, transported, conveyed or removed, as long as the towing operator does not also provide towing services to the general public.

b. The fee for the license issued under this section shall be four hundred (\$400.00) dollars. The license shall remain in effect from January 1 to December 31 of each year or any part thereof. It may be renewed annually by the operator paying a fee of four hundred (\$400.00) dollars.

(Ord. No. 06-34)

**4-34.3 License Application.**

An application for a license as a proprietor of a towing or wrecking business shall be made by the person or firm engaged in operating a wrecker or wreckers. The application shall be made on forms furnished by the Police Department and specifically report the following facts:

a. The full name and address of the applicant. If the application is made for a corporation, it shall state the names and addresses of the officers and directors thereof, its registered office and its registered agent.

b. The year, make and type of each wrecker used in said business, its serial number, registration number and registered owner.

c. The street address of the applicant's storage facilities, including a description of size and capacity.

d. The address where the wrecker or wreckers shall be regularly garaged, the telephone numbers available on a twenty-four-hour-per-day basis and the names of all operators, their addresses and the driver's license numbers of their New Jersey motor vehicle licenses. In order to ensure rapid response to requests for service, all applicants shall maintain a regular place of business within the Borough of Elmwood Park, or within a reasonable distance of the Borough of Elmwood Park not to exceed 3 miles.

#### 4-34.4 Operating Conditions.

By making application to be licensed as a towing operator in the Borough of Elmwood Park, the person or firm agrees to the following conditions:

- a. Provide a prompt, courteous response to each call.
- b. Clean all debris at the accident site emanating from an accident.
- c. Provide the Police Department with the following information on vehicles unclaimed over thirty (30) days:
  1. Year, make, color, registration and vehicle identification number.
  2. Owner's name and address.
  3. Copy of certified letter advising the owner of the vehicle's whereabouts.
  4. Photograph of vehicle.
- d. Maintain a record in a bound volume of all towing and wrecking jobs handled, the name of the owner or operator involved, the charge made for the service, the date and the amount of payment.
- e. Maintain a written schedule of all rates and charges, in compliance with this agreement, and make such schedule available when requested; have conspicuously displayed at the place of business, either painted or permanently affixed, a schedule of maximum towing charges and storage charges permitted by this section. Business hours shall be posted. Whenever practicable, the owner or driver of any vehicle utilizing towing service shall be given a copy of a full statement of rates at the time that the towing services are rendered. In any event, a full schedule of rates shall be annexed to each bill for towing service.
- f. No towing operator or firm licensed under this section may charge rates in excess of the following for towing, conveying, road service or storage of a motor vehicle:
  1. Service charges shall be as follows:
    - (a) Jumpstarts between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. weekdays: \$20.00. Between 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., the following day: \$30.00.
    - (b) Road service at any other time: \$50.00, plus \$1.75 per mile.
    - (c) The service charge assessed for the release of a towed vehicle during other than the business hours of 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.: \$0.00 (no charge).
  2. Towing charges shall be as follows:
    - (a) Automobiles between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. weekdays: \$40.00, plus \$1.75 per mile.
    - (b) Automobiles between 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., weekends and holidays: \$50.00, plus \$1.75 per mile.
    - (c) Vehicles over ten thousand pounds: not to exceed \$200.00 per hour, which includes operator and vehicle.
  3. Dolly service charges shall be as follows:
    - (a) Any automobile, at any time: \$25.00.
    - (b) Flatbed truck between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.: \$60.00, plus \$1.75 per mile.
- g. Flatbed truck between 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.: \$70.00, plus \$1.75 per mile.
  1. Winching service charges shall be \$30.00 per hour.
  2. The service charge for storage after twenty-four (24) hours shall be as follows:
    - (a) Inside building storage facility with a capacity of twenty-one (21) or more spaces: \$30.00 per day.
    - (b) Outside secured storage facility with a capacity of twenty-one (21) or more spaces: \$20.00 per day.
    - (c) Outside storage for commercial vehicles for trucks over one (1) ton, buses, tractor-trailers: \$50.00 per day.

3. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, no towing operator licensed by the Borough of Elmwood Park shall charge or receive fees for towing, services or storage at rates higher than that permitted by the New Jersey State Department of Insurance.

h. In addition to the fees set forth herein, each vehicle towed shall be charged a twenty-five (\$25.00) dollar administrative fee. The administrative fee shall be collected by the tower and remitted to the Borough of Elmwood Park within thirty (30) days.

(Ord. No. 06-34; Ord. No. 11-15)

#### **4-34.5 Equipment and Insurance.**

a. The licensee shall be responsible for the inspection and operation of its equipment. Each wrecker must meet all of the requirements of the New Jersey Revised Statutes, Title 39, Motor Vehicle Rules and Regulations, and have a boom-lifting capacity of at least four (4) tons. In addition, each wrecker must have the following equipment:

1. One (1) large broom and shovel.
2. At least one (1) set of dolly wheels.
3. Steering wheel lock for towing vehicles from the rear.
4. Emergency warning lights.
5. Portable safety lights to be installed on rear of towed vehicle if necessary.
6. Safety flares for night work.

b. The application for a towing and wrecking license shall be accompanied by a certificate of liability insurance for said wrecker in the policy limits of no less than three hundred thousand (\$300,000.00) dollars for one (1) person, three hundred thousand (\$300,000.00) for one (1) accident and three hundred thousand (\$300,000.00) dollars for property damage. The certificate of insurance shall be issued by a company certified to do business in New Jersey, and each policy so required must contain an endorsement providing for thirty (30) days' notice to the Borough of Elmwood Park in the event of any material changes in the policy or cancellation thereof.

(Ord. No. 06-34)

#### **4-34.6 Investigation of Applicant.**

Within ten (10) days after receipt of an application, the Chief of Police shall cause an investigation to be made of the applicant and its business operations. Upon completion of the investigation, the Chief of Police shall make his recommendation to the Borough Clerk/Administrator with respect to the grant or denial of a tow truck operator's license. The Chief of Police shall recommend approval of an application when he finds that the following requirements and certifications have been provided by the applicant:

- a. That the insurance policies as required have been procured and supplied.
- b. That the applicant has certified that the proposed operators are qualified to operate the tow truck and conduct a tow truck service in the Borough of Elmwood Park.
- c. That the applicant has certified that the requirements of this section and all other statutes have been met.
- d. That the applicant has certified that the vehicle has been properly licensed and inspected by the State of New Jersey and has the necessary stickers affixed. No vehicle shall be licensed as a tow truck which is using dealer's plates or which has failed State inspection.

#### **4-34.7 Powers and Duties of Chief of Police.**

a. The Chief of Police is hereby given the authority to hold hearings with regard to violations of the terms and conditions of this section. Notice must be given to the person or firm of any alleged violations of this section. Within twenty (20) days of such notice, a hearing shall be conducted by the Chief of Police. The person or firm charged with such violations shall be given an opportunity to present evidence at this hearing.

b. The Chief of Police shall render a decision regarding the suspension or revocation of the license within five (5) days of the hearing. The person or firm whose license is revoked or suspended may appeal this decision to the Mayor and Council within ten (10) days of the date of the decision by the Chief of Police.

c. The Chief of Police shall see that a record is maintained containing the names, addresses and twenty-four-hour telephone numbers of all licensed wreckers and a record of the types of wreckers available. The Chief of Police shall also see that a record is maintained of all complaints from vehicle owners as to improper service or charges.

#### **4-34.8 Exemptions.**

Other than an emergent situation where reasonable traffic flows or public safety are jeopardized, nothing in this section shall be construed so as to prevent any owner or operator of a motor vehicle from calling any tower or wrecker of his own choice. Nothing in this section shall apply to persons who pick up disabled cars outside the Borough of Elmwood Park and are in the course of taking the vehicles to a garage or location either within or outside the Borough of Elmwood Park. This section shall not apply to persons whose principal place of business as tow truck operators is outside the Borough of Elmwood Park who enter the municipality to pick up a disabled vehicle under a contract for hire with any person engaged in the trucking or transportation business or in the operation of fleets of vehicles. (Ord. No. 06-34)

#### **4-34.9 Violations and Penalties.**

Any person, firm or corporation found guilty in the Municipal Court of the Borough of Elmwood Park of a violation of the terms of this chapter shall be subject to a fine not exceeding five hundred (\$500.00) dollars or imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days. (Ord. No. 06-34)

#### **4-34.10 Annual List of Approved Towing Operators.**

a. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(1)(u), the Mayor and Council shall annually establish a list of approved towing operators to provide those towing services requested by the Borough of Elmwood Park or any departments thereof. Such towing services shall be provided on an equal and rotating basis. Any such towing operator on said list may not delegate his, her or its responsibilities to another towing operator not so listed.

b. To qualify for such listing, the towing operator shall be the holder, in good standing, of a Borough license issued pursuant to subsections 4-34.2 and 4-34.3 of this section and shall have reasonable and adequate motor vehicle storage facilities located within the Borough of Elmwood Park, or a storage facility within 3 miles of the Borough of Elmwood Park. A violation of any of the provisions of this section adjudicated in accordance with subsections 4-34.7 and 4-34.8 of this section shall be deemed to constitute sufficient cause for the removal of such towing operator from such annual listing by the Mayor and Council.

#### **4-34.11 Removal of Unauthorized Vehicle from Private Property.**

The following provisions shall apply to any towing operator, whether or not licensed by the Borough of Elmwood Park, when engaged by the owner or other person in control or possession of private property to remove an unauthorized vehicle therefrom pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-56.6 or Chapter III of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park, New Jersey.

a. No vehicle shall be removed to a storage facility located at a distance greater than three (3) miles from the Borough of Elmwood Park.

b. No towing operator so engaged shall charge any rates greater than those authorized by subsection 4-34.4f. of this section; nor shall any charge be made for any service not specifically set forth in subsection 4-34.4f. of this section.

c. Whenever a vehicle is towed from private property, the Elmwood Park Police Department shall be immediately notified as to the reason of the towing; the year, make and license number of the vehicle; the name and address of the owner, if known; the name and address of the tower; and the address or location to which the vehicle was towed.





BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake the improvement of Boulevard (Sections 8 and 9), consisting of road resurfacing and the undertaking of drainage, curb and sidewalk improvements, where necessary, in, by and for said Borough. It is hereby determined and stated that said road being improved is of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 2. The sum of \$225,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. It is anticipated that a grant in the amount of \$149,000 from the New Jersey Department of Transportation shall be received by the Borough to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof. Any of said grant funds so received shall be applied as set forth in Section 10 hereof. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law, and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$225,000, and (4) \$11,000 of said sum is to be provided by the

down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$214,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$35,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$11,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$11,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$214,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitation prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$214,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be

payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$214,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing

full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.



**RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT PASSAIC VALLEY WATER COMMISSION'S  
STAY OF ITS LT2 ADMINISTRATIVE CONSENT ORDER**

WHEREAS, on October 22, 2014, the Commissioners of the Passaic Valley Water Commission (PVWC) unanimously approved a resolution to authorize and direct the Executive Director, Chief Engineer and General Counsel of the PVWC to file the necessary papers and take other necessary action to petition the Department of Environmental Protection of the State of New Jersey (DEP) and the DEP Commissioner to stay further planning or implementation of the requirements of Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Rules and the Administrative Consent Order (ACO) issued by the DEP, relating to the Levine, Great Notch and New Street Reservoirs (the projects); and

WHEREAS, the PVWC Commissioners have determined, as stated in their approved resolution, that the cost, environmental and cultural impacts of the projects promise to impose major burdens on the individual and commercial communities of PVWC's owner cities and wholesale customers constituting approximately 800,000 customers; and

WHEREAS, the PVWC Commissioners have further determined that the impact of this project on numerous surrounding communities constitutes a major potential impact, both aesthetically and economically; and

WHEREAS, the PVWC Commissioners perceive that a significant segment of the public, which PVWC serves, has not been provided with sufficient information regarding the project and that input and participation in the project whose current cost estimate exceeds \$100 million dollars is warranted and justified; and

WHEREAS, the above referenced resolution specifically directs the Commission to file the papers and take the appropriate action to petition the DEP and its Commissioner for a stay in the proceedings, including, but not limited to, considering revisions to the ACO, to which it is subject, until 2016 or upon completion of the EPA's review of the LT2 regulations, whichever is later; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey are in total agreement with the PVWC's determinations and findings as stated in their resolution, and fully support the PVWC's Commissioners in their decision to file a stay to halt all further proceedings or action regarding the planning or implementation of the projects related to addressing the requirements of EPA rules and the AOC issued by the DEP;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Mayor and Council, of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, hereby directs the Borough Clerk to forward a copy of this supporting resolution, upon its passage, to U.S. Senator Robert Menendez; U.S. Senator Cory Booker; U.S. Congressman William J. ## COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilman Caramagna discussed the upcoming dedication of the gym floor in the High School and the hiring of a new wrestling coach. He announced the Re-Organization Meeting for the Board of Education will take place on January 6, 2015 at 6:30 p.m. Councilman Caramagna stated he feels the Board of Education meetings should be televised so that residents are aware of what is going on with the schools. He mentioned the Library Board will be adding WiFi at the Library and thanked Mr. Golabek for his persistence with requesting the Library have a WiFi connection. Councilman Caramagna congratulated Doris Wechtler on her successful run for the Board of Education. He further thanked Mrs. Perna-Rudman for her service on the Board of Education.

Councilman Dombrowski discussed presentations made to the Board of Health by two entities regarding shared services for the Health Department. He stated a vote will be taken at the next Board of Health meeting and which was sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce. He further discussed the Chamber of Commerce has to date raised \$48,000 in which has been donated to multiple charities including the Elmwood Park Fire Department. He discussed going to St. Joseph's Hospital to watch "Gotta Dance" students dance for the children in the hospital. Councilman Dombrowski also congratulated The Bombers on their Super Bowl championship.

Councilman Vuoncino congratulated the coaches, players and family members of The Bombers on their championship. He stated 3 new police officers will be sworn in at the December 18, 2014 Mayor and Council meeting. Councilman Vuoncino discussed NASA's attempt to deploy ORION into space. He followed up with discussion about an article regarding the Superintendent of School, Dr. Tomko's intention to improve school scores utilizing STEM. 
