**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING AN ORDINANCE (ORDINANCE NO.:
88-1 ET SEQ. OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK.**

WHEREAS, CHAPTER 88-7 of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park” provides “Definitions and Word Usage”; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council believe that it would be beneficial to add a definition for “Fast Food Restaurant” and permit “Fast Food Restaurants and Drive-In Restaurants” in Certain Districts.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 88-7 shall be amended to include the following new definition:

FAST-FOOD RESTAURANT- An establishment or business, which is essentially designed to dispense a limited variety of food and beverages, which are so prepared, packaged in paper, or in other types of disposable wrappers and containers in a form for quick or ready consumption. The aforementioned may or may not be sold for consumption inside the building or on or off the premises.

SECTION 2: Chapter 88-20.3 shall be amended as follows: Fast Food Restaurants and Drive-In Restaurants are permitted in the following districts: C-L (Local Commerce), C-G (General Commerce) & C-O (Office). Conditional in District POP (Planned Office Park).

SECTION 3: Repealer

All Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that same are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 4: Invalid Provisions

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication thereof as provide by law.

ORDINANCE 14-07**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 3-10 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK TITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT PARKING VEHICLES ON POSTED LANDS IN THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK AND TO FIX PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1:

1. Unlawful to Park or Leave Standing.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park or-leave standing any vehicle on lands of another, whether publicly or privately Owned, in the Borough of Elmwood Park, after notice has been posted as hereinafter provided by the owner, occupant, lessee or licensee prohibiting such parking. Nothing herein contained shall apply to any lands lying within the bounds of any public street or highway.

2. Posting of Signs.

Suitable signs not less than eighteen (18) inches by twenty-four (24) inches, bearing the words "NO PARKING," together with any qualifications or restrictions of such parking, if any, and conspicuously displayed, shall be posted on said lands by the owner, occupant, lessee or licensee thereof where this section is effective. Defacing, tampering with or damaging such signs when posted shall constitute a violation of this section.

3. Penalties

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine not exceeding fifty \$50 dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days or both at the discretion of the Municipal Magistrate/Judge.

SECTION 2: Repealer

All Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that same are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3: Invalid Provisions

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication thereof as provide by law.

ORDINANCE NO. : 14-01

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CURRENT BUILDING SUBCODE FEES FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, CHAPTER X (10-1.3).

WHEREAS, CHAPTER X (10-1.3) of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park entitled "Construction and Buildings" provides for the Fees required to be paid for construction in the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park has entered into a shared services Contract with the Borough of Fair Lawn; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park is required to adopt a fee schedule that is the same as the fee schedule of the Borough of Fair Lawn.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 10-1.3a 1 (Building Subcode fees) of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park is hereby amended as follows:

The fee for a construction permit shall be the sum of the subcode fees listed in Subsection A through H hereof and shall be paid before the permit is issued. All fees will be rounded to the nearest dollar.

A. The building subcode fees shall be:

(1) For new construction, \$0.048 per cubic foot of building or structure volume, provided that the minimum fee shall be:

(a) Principal building: \$500.

(b) Accessory building: \$200.

(d) Swimming pool shall be a flat fee:

[1] In-ground pool: \$275, which shall include required fence.

[2] Aboveground pool: \$125, which shall include required fence.

(e) Fences in excess of six feet in height or pool protection fence: \$22 per \$1,000 with a minimum fee of \$80.

(2) For renovations, alterations and repairs:

(a) Twenty-Five dollars for each \$1,000 or part thereof estimated cost up to \$50,000, provided that the minimum fee shall be \$75.

(b) Twenty-one dollars for each \$1,000 or part thereof estimated cost from \$50,001 and up.

(4) Tents in excess of 900 square feet or more than 30 feet in any dimension shall be a flat fee of \$115.

(5) For additions: \$0.048 per cubic foot of building or structure volume added, provided that the minimum fee shall be \$350.

(6) For combinations of renovations and additions, the sum of the fees are computed separately as renovations and additions.

(7) For Use Groups S and F, as established by the Uniform Construction Code, the fee shall be \$0.035 per cubic foot of building or structure:

(a) Up to 500,000 cubic feet, provided that the minimum fee shall be \$500.

(b) From 500,001 cubic feet to 1,000,000 cubic feet: \$0.030 per cubic foot of building or structure volume.

(c) From 1,000,001 cubic feet and up: \$0.025 per cubic foot of building or structure volume.

(8) Oil tank removal / abandonment Use Group U.

(b) Oil tank to 550 gallons, install or remove:

[1] Residential: \$80.

[2] Commercial: \$150.

(c) Oil tank over 550 gallons, install or remove:

[1] Residential: \$80

[2] Commercial: \$225.

(d) Gasoline tanks, install or remove: \$250.

(9) The fee for demolition of a building or structure shall be:

(a) Accessory building or structure: \$110.

(b) Townhouse, condominium or multiple dwelling, per unit: \$160.

(c) One- or two-family dwelling: \$235.

(d) Commercial/industrial building or structure:

[1] 0 to 10,000 square feet: \$0.13 per square foot.

[2] 10,000 to 20,000 square feet: \$0.09 per square foot.

[3] Above 20,000 square feet: \$0.05 per square foot.

[4] Minimum fee: \$375.

(10) The fee for a permit for the removal of a building or structure from one lot to another or to a new location on the same lot shall be \$12 per \$1,000 or portion thereof of the sum of the estimated costs for moving.

SECTION 2: Repealer

All Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that same are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.


SECTION 3: Invalid Provisions

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: Effective Date





BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE UNDERTAKING OF VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS TO ENGLISH AVENUE PARK IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$200,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake various improvements to English Avenue Park in, by and for said Borough. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. The sum of \$200,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. It is anticipated that a grant in the amount of \$100,000 shall be received by the Borough from the County of Bergen Open Space, Recreation, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund to finance the cost of said purpose. Said grant funds shall be applied as set forth in Section 10 hereof. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$200,000, and (4) \$10,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down

payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$190,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$22,200 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$10,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$10,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$190,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$190,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall,

to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of fifteen years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$190,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of

the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 11-5 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK TITLED "REGISTRATION OF GUEST OF MOTELS, HOTELS AND GUEST LODGES."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter XI, Section 11-5 of the Code of the Borough off Elmwood Park titled "REGISTRATION OF GUEST OF MOTELS, HOTELS AND GUEST LODGES." is hereby amended by deleting the existing Section 11-5 and replacing it with the following

11-5 REGISTRATION OF GUEST OF MOTELS, HOTELS AND GUEST LODGES.

11-5.1 Definitions.

As used in this section:

Business of conducting tourist lodges, camps, cabins, inns, motels and hotels shall mean the renting, leasing, maintaining, keeping, operating, conducting or providing of over night or temporary sleeping accommodation for a consideration to tourists, transients or travelers in any building or structure or group of buildings or structures devoted to or primarily used by said business commonly known as tourist lodge, tourist cabin, motor lodges, motor courts, tourist courts, tourist camps, inns, motels, hotels, guest houses or guest rooms and boarding houses; whether meals are served therein or not.

Hotel shall mean every building kept, used, maintained, advertised as or held out to be a place where sleeping accommodations are supplied for pay to permanent or transient guests in which rooms on the premises are rented, furnished and shall include any rooms found to be arranged for or used for sleeping purposes with or without meals for the accommodation of such guests or every building or part thereof which is rented, for hire, for sleeping accommodations. This definition shall not be construed to include any building defined as a tenement house in Title 55, Subtitle 1, Chapters 1 to 13 of N.J.S.A., recorded as a tenement house under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Tenement House Supervision and occupied exclusively as such.

Housing or lodging unit shall mean any room, cabin or quarters, whether or not physically attached or connected with any other buildings or structures, used for sleeping accommodations, in the business of conducting tourist lodges, motels, motor courts, cabins, camps, boarding houses, hotels or motels. (Ord. No. 88-7 § 3)

11-5.2 Registration Required/Room Limitations.

a. No person shall occupy and no tourist lodge, cabin, camp, inn, hotel and motels and guest house, hereinafter referred to as the hotel, shall permit any person to occupy any room on the premises unless the person registering for said room or accommodations, for any time whatsoever, shall first display to the authorized agent or employee of the hotel in charge of reservations, written evidence of his or her identity and residence. Any identification presented shall be identification deemed acceptable by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) Among which shall be at least a drivers license, passport or military identification card or, in lieu of a drivers license, any two (2) of the following; birth certificate, alien registration card, government identification card or any other form of identification which is reasonably reliable to prove the identity of the person so registering. In addition thereto, the person so registering shall write or cause to be written on the record card, in ink, his or her full and true name and address and a full and true name of each member of his or her party and the State license or registration number of any motor vehicle conveying the person to the licensed premises.

b. In addition thereto, the hotel authorized agent or employee shall cause to be written in the register in ink the number of the room assigned to each registrant, the date and hour of the registration, the signature or identification of the person taking or accepting the registration and the date when occupant or occupants of each room quits or surrenders the same.(Ord. No. 88-7 § 1; Ord. No. 89-1 § 1)

c. The motel/hotel operator shall make a photocopy of the registered guest's driver's license and/or other form of identification that would be recognized by the TSA; in addition to listing the registration of their vehicle or vehicles, in addition to signing of and/or acknowledgement of restrictions. Such

acknowledgment shall also specifically state the guest registrant understands and agrees that if the room rented by that guest registrant shall be found to have more than six (6) persons in his/her standard room, that the guest registrant, other guests for that room and all visitors shall be subject to immediate removal from the room at the request of the operator; and the guest registrant may be issued a summons for a violation of this chapter, which carries a fine of one thousand two hundred fifty (\$1,250.00) dollars.

d. A licensee shall have the authority to ask the head of a party or any person renting accommodations on the licensed premises for written evidence of his or her identity and residence and, in addition thereto, the full and true name and address of each member of his or her party; and in the case of an operator of a motor vehicle, the state and license or registration number of the motor vehicle conveying him or her to the licensed premises. In addition to the other rules and regulations proposed hereunder, no licensee shall knowingly rent, allow or permit any room on the licensed premises to be used for any immoral or illegal purpose, and the failure to set forth the true identity of and correct hours of occupancy by any person shall be deemed to show knowledge on the part of the license holder of such immoral or illegal purpose or use.

11-5.3 Exception.

A residential dwelling which does not have more than five (5) rooms rented or used for tourist business is not governed or regulated by this section. (Ord. No. 88-7 § 3)

11-5.4 Inspections.

It shall be the duty of the Police Department to inspect the licensed premises from time to time during regular business hours; and also to inspect the registration card or other documents executed by the registrant and also the documents executed by the authorized agent or employee of the hotel, in order to determine the provisions of this section are being complied with. Unannounced inspections will not be made except during normal business hours of the hotel unless the Police are conducting a specific investigation and require emergency inspection of the books and records. Routine inspection of the rooms will not be permitted unless the Police are responding to an emergency call. (Ord. No. 88-7 § 2; Ord. No. 89-1 § 2)

11-5.5 Access to Registration.

It shall be unlawful for an operator of a motel/hotel to fail to require identification of the guest registrant as required above; or refuse to provide such information to a Police Officer.

11-5.6 Records.

The motel/hotel operator shall maintain all registration records and proof of identification for a period five (5) years. Records shall be kept on the premises for the first year and may then be stored off site.

11-5.7. Signage.

The motel/hotel operator shall cause to be installed/posted in a conspicuous area stating that "This establishment has a no tolerance policy for production of proper identification."

11-5.8 Any violation of any provision of this ordinance shall subject a person(s) to a fine one thousand two hundred fifty (\$1,250.00) dollars. Each and every violation of any portion of this chapter shall be considered a separate violation of this chapter.

SECTION 2: Repealer

COMMITTEE REPORT

Councilman Caramagna discussed an article in The Community News regarding new businesses coming into the Borough and the Planning Board. He further discussed the process and stated he would like to see copies of the applications in advance therefore affording the time to review the applications before the meetings. Councilman Caramagna stated there will be a \$57 tax increase based on the average cost of \$330,000 for the 2014 Municipal Budget. He credited this to the prudent spending by the Mayor, Council and CFO Roy Riggitano. Councilman Caramagna thanked Daniel Golabek for bringing attention to the lack of WiFi in the Library.

Councilman Dombrowski wished the Bomber Cheerleaders luck as they will be leaving for a competition in Hershey, PA. Councilman Dombrowski discussed the lack of WiFi at the Library and asked the Borough Attorney to look into the legality of having a separate area of the Library for adults only that is equipped with WiFi. Councilman Dombrowski suggested looking into all options regarding WiFi and believes that the Library Board is open for discussions. Councilman Dombrowski wished his wife who is present aHappy Birthday.

Councilman Vuoncino does not understand why the filter that is on the hardline internet connection at the Library cannot also be placed on WiFi. He discussed the appointment of an Officer in Charge. He further discussed the upcoming retirement of Chief Thomas Johnson. He commended Chief Johnson and wished him luck in the future. Councilman Vuoncino congratulated Captain Michael Foligno on his appointment as Officer in Charge.

Councilman Martino discussed his lack of understanding regarding the Library Board decision not to have wifi accessibility.

Councilman Pettigano stated he will be meeting with the Superintendent of Public Works to discuss some concerns.

Councilman Colletti discussed the municipal budget. Councilman Colletti discussed Councilman Caramagna's request to view Planning Board applications earlier than what is presently being done. He discussed the JIF Safety Awards Breakfast at Stoney Hill in which all Councilmen have an invitation to attend. Councilman Colletti stated he will be attending the next Chief's Meeting with the Fire Department and he will make a report at the next public meeting. He reminded residents that if their property is located adjacent to a fire hydrant it is their responsibility to keep them clear of all snow and debris.

Mayor Mola discussed the 5% increase to the water rates. He further discussed this increase is a pass along from Passaic Valley Water Commission to the residents. Mayor Mola encouraged Legislature to extend the 2% cap for arbitrations. Mayor Mola discussed both the work and public meeting of the Planning Board. He further discussed that Councilman Caramagna can pick up the documentation from the Planning Board in the Building Department prior to the meeting. Mayor Mola spoke about the Library Boards decisions are made to protect the children and other resident of the Borough.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Keith Work, Gilbert Avenue, inquired about the reasoning behind possibly changing the powers of the Recreation Commission. He discussed various improvements made with the Borough by the Recreation Commission. Mr. Work discussed the members and the time which they volunteer outside of their careers for the Borough. He further discussed his thoughts that changing from a Commission to an Advisory Board will be a bad decision.

Thomas Barillo, Elmwood Drive, inquired about work that was completed on a recent water main break. Mr. Barillo inquired about damage on Borough vehicles and suggested Elmwood Park have the same policy as Woodland Park regarding damage to Borough vehicle by employees. Mr. Barillo commented on the snow cleanup in the Borough.

Donald Ingrasselino, Florence Place, discussed a newspaper article regarding Police Department retirements and running the department with a 5% cap that was in place during in 1980.

Mel Kaplan, Glenwood Avenue, who is a member of the Planning Board discussed the distribution of application at the work session. He stated at that time questions may be asked regarding the application. He further stated if anyone has any questions they have the opportunity to ask them at the public meeting before the approval of the application.

Geroge Nestory, Arena Court, discussed the fire hydrant poles will aid the DPW when plowing and will help to locate fire hydrant that may be buried in the snow. Councilman Colletti stated he has seen some poles but not on all hydrants. Councilman Colletti will reach out to the Fire Chief to discuss the poles for hydrants. Mr. Nestory inquired about the Synkote Paint building on Van Riper Avenue. Mayor discussed the approximate cost to remediate the property. Mr. Kazmark discussed federal liens on the property. Mr. Nestory discussed his thoughts to alleviate waste water issues.

Rich Trawinski, Walnut Street, stated the Council has had discussion regarding the Synkote Paint building. Mr. Trawinski stated once an application is submitted to the Building Department, any Planning Board member can obtain a copy of the application. He further stated that if the Planning Board choses to so a site visit, the visit must be published and recorded. He stated that if an individual chooses to do a site plan, they may do so but cannot have discussions with the applicant and also must report their findings to the Planning Board.

A motion was made my Councilman Colletti and seconded by Councilman Dombrowski to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.
