REGULAR MEETING OF THE ELMWOOD PARK MAYOR AND COUNCIL JANUARY 16, 2014 8:00 P.M.

1. CALL TO ORDER:

The Public Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park was called to order on Thursday, January 2, 2014 at 8:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building, 182 Market Street, Elmwood Park, New Jersey.

On Roll Call Council Members: Colletti, Dombrowski, Martino, Pettigano, Vuoncino and Caramagna were present. Also present were Mayor Mola and Borough Clerk Keith Kazmark and Borough Attorney Giuseppe Randazzo.

3. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE:

Whereas, Chapter 231 of the Public Laws of the State of New Jersey requires at the commencement of every meeting a Statement of Compliance be read by the presiding officer.

Now, Therefore Be Advised, that the meeting requirements for this meeting have been met by publishing an annual meeting notice in The Record of Hackensack and Herald News of Woodland Park and by posting such notice in the office of the Borough Clerk as well as in a public place within the Municipal Building, and by notifying interested citizens. Said notice was been posted on January 1, 2014.

4. PRESENTATION OF SCHOOL REFERENDUM

Borough Clerk Keith Kazmark invited Dr. Tomko to the podium. Dr. Tomko introduced the members of the Board of Education along with the District's architect. Dr. Tomko discussed the scope of the work for all district schools. Mr. Egan, State Monitor, discussed the funding for 42% of the project will be provided by the State. He further discussed the repairs needed for all district schools. Mr. Egan stated the average cost to the taxpayer if the referendum was successful would amount to \$6 per month. He discussed the timetable for some of the repairs. Mayor Mola asked if anyone had any questions regarding the referendum.

Richard Trawinski, Walnut Street, inquired as to the contingency percentage per building. Mr. Egan stated the percentage is 9%.

Michael Buffis, Phillip Avenue, inquired about the cost of the project and the funds that are being covered by the State. Mr. Egan explained the breakdown of the funding for the project.

Jeffrey Freitag, Hillman Drive, inquired about contingency fees for the project. Mr. Egan stated the fees are there for unforeseen issues while the work is being completed. Mr. Freitag inquired as to when the District will receive reimbursement monies. Mr. Egan discussed the process of reimbursement.

Mayor Mola inquired as to the timing of the reimbursement and if it can reduce the amount of interest paid on the bond. The District's Bond Counsel stated the reimburse will go towards reducing the amount of interest paid by the taxpayers.

Resident (name & address inaudible), discussed the work that needs to be done and the hesitation that the public may have regarding the completion of repairs that need to be done. Mr. Egan stated that one of his responsibilities as the State Monitor is to make sure that the funds go to the repairs that are approved to be made.

Councilman Vuoncino asked for the schedule of the project. Mr. Egan stated that an attempt will be made to do as many projects as necessary at one time. Councilman Vuoncino asked the impact to the classrooms while the repairs are being done. Mr. Egan stated that the roofing will be done during the summer while windows can be worked on at night after the children have left.

Councilman Caramagna stated all the repairs that are listed are necessary.

Councilman Dombrowski asked Mr. Egan what would happen if the referendum does not pass. Mr. Egan stated he would encourage the Board of Education appeal the vote and ask the Department of Education to overturn the vote. He further stated the process could take over a year and by that time the grant money may no longer be available leaving the residents responsible for the entire cost of the project.

Councilman Colletti discussed his multiple tours of the school buildings to view the repairs that need to be made. He further discussed the available State grant funds for the project.

Councilman Pettigano inquired as to how often the State makes funds available and asked for verification as to whether or not the grant funds would be available if the referendum was to fail. Mr. Egan stated that the funds may not be available.

Councilman Martino made a comparison of the cost of a dinner for two to the amount of the tax increase for the referendum. He commented on putting a price on the safety of the children of the District.

Mayor Mola stated he was not in favor of the two prior referendums, but is in favor of the current one. Mayor Mola followed up inquiring whether another referendum will follow for additional items for the District. Mr. Egan stated while there are still more items that need to be addressed, he does not feel a referendum is needed to address them but rather will be funded in the school budget. Mayor Mola inquired whether if the project was increased would the State give 42% on a higher amount. Mr. Egan stated the State would not. He further stated that he believes the other repairs can be done by budgeting their expenses within their operational budget.

Resident, (name & address inaudible), discussed the advertising for prior referendums and the lack of advertising for this one. She further discussed the Mayor's comment about asking for more money to do the other repairs.

Mayor Mola thanked Dr. Tomko, Mr. Egan and the other members of the Board of Education for attending the meeting and informing the public on the referendum.

Councilman Martino stated that if the people believe what they were told tonight to spread the word to their friends. He further stated that while Gilbert Avenue School he placed a glue stick on a student's desk and it rolled away and that it concerns him.

BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK ORDINANCE NO.: 14-01

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CURRENT BUILDING SUBCODE FEES FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, CHAPTER X (10-1.3).

WHEREAS, CHAPTER X (10-1.3) of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park entitled "Construction and Buildings" provides for the Fees required to be paid for construction in the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park has entered into a shared services Contract with the Borough of Fair Lawn; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park is required to adopt a fee schedule that is the same as the fee schedule of the Borough of Fair Lawn.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 10-1.3a 1 (Building Subcode fees) of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park is hereby amended as follows:

The fee for a construction permit shall be the sum of the subcode fees listed in Subsection A through H hereof and shall be paid before the permit is issued. All fees will be rounded to the nearest dollar.

A. The building subcode fees shall be:

- (1) For new construction, \$0.045 per cubic foot of building or structure volume, provided that the minimum fee shall be:
 - (a) Principal building: \$500.
 - (b) Accessory building: \$200.
 - (d) Swimming pool shall be a flat fee:
 - [1] In-ground pool: \$250, which shall include required fence.
 - [2] Aboveground pool: \$100, which shall include required fence.
 - (e) Fences in excess of six feet in height or pool protection fence: \$22 per \$1,000 with a minimum fee of \$75.
- (2) For renovations, alterations and repairs:
 - (a) Twenty-two dollars for each \$1,000 or part thereof estimated cost up to \$50,000, provided that the minimum fee shall be \$75.
 - (b) Eighteen dollars for each \$1,000 or part thereof estimated cost from \$50,001 and up.
- (3) Intentionally left blank.
- (4) Tents in excess of 900 square feet or more than 30 feet in any dimension shall be a flat fee of \$100.
- (5) For additions: \$0.045 per cubic foot of building or structure volume added, provided that the minimum fee shall be \$300.
- (6) For combinations of renovations and additions, the sum of the fees are computed separately as renovations and additions.
- (7) For Use Groups S and F, as established by the Uniform Construction Code, the fee shall be \$0.030 per cubic foot of building or structure:
 - (a) Up to 500,000 cubic feet, provided that the minimum fee shall be \$450.
 - (b) From 500,001 cubic feet to 1,000,000 cubic feet: \$0.025 per cubic foot of building or structure volume.
 - (c) From 1,000,001 cubic feet and up: \$0.020 per cubic foot of building or structure volume.
- (8) Intentionally left blank.
- (9) The fee for demolition of a building or structure shall be:
 - (a) Accessory building or structure: \$100.
 - (b) Townhouse, condominium or multiple dwelling, per unit: \$150.
 - (c) One- or two-family dwelling: \$225.
 - (d) Commercial/industrial building or structure:
 - [1] 0 to 10,000 square feet: \$0.10 per square foot.
 - [2] 10,000 to 20,000 square feet: \$0.07 per square foot.
 - [3] Above 20,000 square feet: \$0.03 per square foot.
 - [4] Minimum fee: \$350.
- (10) The fee for a permit for the removal of a building or structure from one lot to another or to a new location on the same lot shall be \$12 per \$1,000 or portion thereof of the sum of the estimated costs for moving.

SECTION 2: Repealer

All Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that same are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3: Invalid Provisions

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication thereof as provide by law.

BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK ORDINANCE 14-02

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER VII OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK TITLED "TRAFFIC".

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter VII of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park titled "Traffic" is hereby amended by deleting the existing Section 7-8.3 titled "Temporary Parking Prohibition for Snow Plowing and Removal," and replacing it with the following:

§7-8.3 - Temporary Parking Prohibition for Snow Plowing and Removal.

a. Whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that it covers the street or highway, an emergency shall exist during the snow fall and for a period of 24 hours following the end of the snow fall and no vehicles shall be parked on the following streets or highways or portions thereof listed below.

The parking prohibitions listed below shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased, until the streets have been plowed significantly, and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.

- b. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation of this subsection shall be deemed a nuisance and a menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any Police Officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of the removal and storage which may result from such removal before regaining possession of the vehicle.
 - c. The effectiveness of this subsection is contingent upon signs being erected as required by law.
- d. Unless some penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation of this subsection or any supplement thereto, shall be liable to a penalty of a minimum of fifty \$50 dollars but not more than two hundred (\$200.00) dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days or both.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilman Martino stated a \$500 donation was made to the Homeowner's Association. He further stated that Mr. Egan will be speaking at a Homeowner's Association meeting. Councilman Martino stated the polls for the referendum will be open from 2:00-9:00 p.m.

Councilman Pettigano discussed current Recreation programs. He further discussed the conclusion of the Winter Break Camp. Councilman Pettigano discussed upcoming programs through the Recreation Department and the upcoming rehabilitation of the Senior Kitchen. He stated that Ms. Puglisi would like to extend her thanks to the Athletic Director at the High School for allowing the Recreation basketball to hold practices at the district schools.

Councilman Colletti discussed a recent Fire Department meeting and items discussed at the meeting. He further discussed the resident's responsibility to dig out any fire hydrants that are adjacent to their homes.

Councilman Vuoncino discussed a recent incident where men disguised as public utilities workers gained access to a residence and robbed the home while the occupants were kept busy. He stated residents should not allow anyone into their home unless they made the request through a utility company. He further stated that any resident that has any doubts can call the Police Department. Councilman Vuoncino stated the Ambulance Corps. will be celebrating their 50th Anniversary at their installment dinner.

Councilman Dombrowski reiterated the importance of the referendum and stated that the project could cost residents more if the vote fails and the State mandates the repairs to be made. Councilman Dombrowski congratulates Mr. Polite for being selected the Athlete of the Week. Councilman Dombrowski discussed the licensing of cats and dogs during the month of January. He further discussed the town wide canvassing that will be conducted regarding cat and dog licenses. Councilman Dombrowski discussed attending a County Freeholder meeting to open a dialogue regarding Artisen Fields.

Councilman Caramagna discussed the orientation conducted by the State League of Municipalities that himself, Councilman Dombrowski and Councilman Martino attended. He discussed the previous Planning Board Meeting and items before the Board. Councilman Caramagna thanked Board President Louise Girardi, Vice President Keith Cannizzo and board member Daniel Golabek for attending tonight's meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Jeff Freitag, Hillman Drive discussed the snow parking ordinance and possible inaccuracies for certain streets. Borough Clerk Keith Kazmark stated the ordinance was duplicated from the ordinance prior to the alternate side of the street parking rules. However, Mr. Kazmark could not attest as to the signage used on the borough roadways. Mr. Frietag stated with the approach of the end of winter, the ordinance should be reviewed at a later date to verify the ordinance and the signage is correct.

Daniel Golabek, Godwin Avenue, thanked Councilman Martino for stating the date and time of the referendum vote. Mr. Golabek inquired about WiFi in the Library. Mayor Mola instructed Mr. Golabek to reach out to the Library Director, Ms. Protono.

Jeanne Freitag, Hillman Drive, thanked the Council for allowing the Board of Education to discuss the referendum. She stated information regarding the project is available on the district website. She further stated the date and hours for the referendum vote.

Robert Buckalew, Parkview Avenue, stated he is a former President of the Chamber of Commerce. He discussed the membership, the functions of the Chamber and the hope to expand the membership.

William Meneely, Washington Avenue, inquired about the rational regarding the appointment of the Borough Prosecutor. Councilman Dombrowski stated the committee did their due diligence and believe the person who they are backing for the position can do just as good if not better job that Mr. DeMaria. Mr. Meneely stated if the Police are comfortable with Mr. De Maria and the decision not to re-appoint Mr. DeMaria had nothing to do with his job performance, why would a chance be taken with another Prosecutor. Councilman Dombrowski asked for guidance regarding his answer. Mr. Kazmark stated the salary for that position falls under the threshold and does not require the submission of a RFP/RFQ. Councilman Dombrowski then stated the person who is going to be put up for the appointment is Elsbeth Crusius, who is currently appointed as the Alternate Prosecutor. Councilman Dombrowski stated that Ms. Crusius has high credentials, at which time Mr. Meneely commented Mr. DeMaria has higher credentials. Mr. Meneely further commented that he hopes the appointment is not a political decision, the decision

should be made based on what is best for the residents. Mayor Mola stated he hopes the Council reconsider the appointment and re-appoint Mr. DeMaria.

Rich Trawinski, Walnut Street, discussed the lack of WiFi in the Library. He further discussed the resurfacing that was done in the Library during 30° temperatures. Mr. Trawinski thanked Councilman Dombrowski and Mr. Golabek for attending the Freeholder Meeting and discussing Artisen Fields. He discussed prior discussions and decisions pertaining to the County property. Mr. Trawinski further discussed his thoughts moving forward with said property.

Mike Buffis, Phillip Avenue, discussed a speeding issue on Phillip Avenue. He stated his vehicles has been side swiped multiple times. Mr. Buffis feels the speeding has increased since the opening of the Twisted Elm. He proposed the Council look into creating an ordinance which would require all establishments selling alcohol to have a Compliance Officer. Mr. Buffis discussed issues with the wood burning stove that is located at the Twisted Elm. Mr. Buffis stated the earlier report by Councilman Vuoncino regarding the theft by perpetrators posing as utility workers affected him personally. He also stated the positioning of cameras along Market Street could have led to an arrest in the case.

Jessica Broger, Market Street, discussed certificate occupancies and continuing certificate of occupancies for incoming businesses. She further discussed the costs and time it takes to receive the certificates. Ms. Broger was accompanied by Mr. Buckelew, who stated they have been approached by businesses claiming it took months to start their business in the Borough. He further stated that he is not aware of the paperwork that was submitted or lack thereof. Mayor Mola discussed the process of businesses going before the Planning Board. Councilman Caramagna commended former Councilman Rich Trawinski for being part of changing the process for continuing certificate of occupancies. He stated he feels that the process has improved and the importance of letting the applicant know all the documentation that is necessary for the application. Councilman Colletti asked for verification to Ms. Broger concerns because it was his understanding the issues of the continuing certificate of occupancy was resolved. Ms. Borger stated that the concern is regarding new businesses that are not considered "like-business". Mayor Mola stated the Building Department refers businesses to the Planning Board when needed.

Rich Trawinski, Walnut Street, expressed to Councilman Caramagna that he appreciated the comments made regarding his part of the CCO ordinance. He stated the process took several months to adopt the ordinance. He further stated he has ideas to improve the ordinance.

Peter Vergan, (inaudible address), discussed the drainage issue on Market Street.

Mike Buffis, Phillip Avenue, stated he was appalled by Councilman Martino's comment stating residents not able to afford the increase should move out. Councilman Martino stated he did not make that statement.

Doug DeMatteo, Lincoln Avenue, discussed the work completed in the High School Auditorium. He further discussed the prior referendum and objects to comments there was a misappropriation of funds. Mr. DeMatteo commented on prior school budgets that failed and the cuts made by the Mayor and Council.

Karen Varrecchia, Market Street, discussed the drainage issue on Market Street. Councilman Colletti inquired about the amount of the standing water to better understand if the issue is a result of lack of storm drains or the pitch of the roadway. Ms. Varrecchia stated it should be addressed prior to the resurfacing of Market Street.

Rich Trawinski, Walnut Street, stated Soundview is planning on lighting the Marcal sign during Super Bowl weekend.

Mayor Mola closed the public portion of the meeting.

Councilman Martino apologized for any inappropriate comment that may have been made.

Mayor Mola discussed comments made by Mr. DeMatteo regarding the Board of Education and past budgets.

A motion was made by Councilman Vuoncino and seconded by Councilman Caramagna to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously.
