WHEREAS, on September 9, 2015, representatives of the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) presented an overview to officials from Bergen County, the Borough of Elmwood Park, Township of Saddle Brook, Township of Rochelle Park, Borough of Lodi and the City of Hackensack of a proposed reconstruction and resurfacing project plan on Route I-80 West bound; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that 9 miles of I-80 West bound requires reconstruction, 1 mile of ramp reconstruction, 3 miles of ramp milling and overlay, 2 miles of mainline widening, sixteen (16) bridge deck replacements, three (3) bridge superstructure replacements, 1 bridge replacement, drainage improvements and to correct substandard elements where practicable; and

WHEREAS, the project is in the Concept Development phase and will be graduated to Preliminary Engineering in the near future to complete the technical and environmental studies, after which the project would move into final design and construction to commence in 2020; and

WHEREAS, in order to minimize inconveniences to the traveling public during the daytime hours, all thru lanes on I-80 West bound will be maintained at all times, one west bound lane will be shifted to the eastbound side at the Paterson viaduct (vicinity of Spring Street); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park believes that the reconstruction and resurfacing project plan of Route I-80 west bound as described above is important to the safety of motorists and therefore endorses and supports the Project; and





**AUTHORIZE SHARED SERVICE AGREEMENT
BEFORE/AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM
ELMWOOD PARK BOARD OF EDUCATION**

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act N.J.S.A 40A:65-1, et seq., authorized local units of the State of New Jersey to enter into an agreement with any other local unit or units to provide or receive any service that each local unit in the participating in the agreement is empowered to provide or receive in its own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park (hereafter also referred to as "Borough") is in need of morning care and after care services for school children; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park Board of Education (hereafter also referred to as "Board of Education") currently provides morning care and after care services to school children; and

WHEREAS, the Elmwood Park Board of Education has decided that it will cease providing morning care and after care services for school children; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park has discussed with Elmwood Park Board of Education taking over the morning care and after care services for school children; and

WHEREAS, the parties have negotiated an agreement for the aforementioned; and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of this undertaking are set below; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park and Elmwood Park Board of Education in an effort to more economically and efficiently provide government services, the governing bodies have each duly authorized their proper officials to enter into and execute this agreement.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises hereafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:

1. The Borough shall be responsible for the hiring, paying, bookkeeping, collecting, etc. associated with the day-to-day operation of the morning care and after care services.
2. The Board of Education shall permit the Borough to use the Board of Education facilities located at the various schools, during the hours of 7:30a.m. to 8:30a.m and 3:00pm-6:00pm when needed, Monday through Friday, during the school year. The program will not operate during emergency closings due to weather, when there is a delayed opening or on any days that schools are closed. The Board of Education will also permit the Borough to utilize one district bus for afternoon pickup at the various schools.
3. All staff that is provided by the Borough for this program agrees to provide the necessary supervision and administration inherent in providing this program. Prior to the commencement of employment, all staff will submit to a criminal background check/fingerprinting either at their own expense or at the expense of the Borough, the results of which shall be provided upon request of the Board.
4. The Borough shall operate the program in compliance with all State laws and codes. Staff to include child ratios shall meet New Jersey licensing requirements.
5. The Borough agrees to maintain in full force and effect, comprehensive liability insurance, and name the Board of Education as an additional insured for this program. Additionally, the Borough shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Board of Education collectively and individually for any act of omission arising out of or in the


- course of the performance or the duties associated with the operation of the morning care and after care program which results in a claim by a third party.
6. The Board of Education shall not receive any funds and/or compensation from the program.
 7. The Borough of Elmwood Park shall be designated as the "lead agency" under this agreement.
 8. This agreement shall be effective commencing September 1, 2015 and shall expire on June 30, 2016. However, either party has the right to terminate this agreement for any reason on ninety (90) days written notice to the other party following the adoption of a resolution by the governing body of the entity authorizing the termination. In the event that either party defaults in the performance of any of its obligations under this agreement after receiving written notice of same and failing to cure such default within (30) days of said written notice, the non-defaulting party shall be entitled to terminate this agreement.
 9. This agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the Borough of Elmwood Park and the Elmwood Park Board of Education and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, and/or agreements either written or oral. This agreement shall not be mended, modified or altered during the terms hereof except upon mutual agreements of the parties expressed in writing and signed with the same formality as this agreement.
 10. This agreement is conditioned upon approval of the Division of Local Government Services and the Department of Community Affairs if and to the extent such approval may be required by law or regulation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Resolution 306-15 is hereby rescinded.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilman Caramagna discussed the progress of the field improvements at the high school.

Council President Dombrowski reported on the upcoming flu clinics. He announced the Chamber of Commerce Bowling Night. The Council President discussed the Project Graduation events which have been held and are being organized. He further discussed the ceremony to be held on the soccer field at the high school this Saturday, October 17, 2015.

Councilman Vuoncino discussed recent activity and accomplishments relative to the Police Department. He discussed the benefits of the new table of organization in the Police Department. The Councilman discussed the joint meeting with the Library Board. He discussed the PSE&G energy audit which was authorized by resolution tonight. He discussed the ambulance upgrades and the Volunteer Ambulance Corps. upcoming dinner.

Councilman Martino discussed the Inform newspaper. He stated many issues are from last year and addressed some of the issues in the publication. He announced the Bombers event with the New York Jets.

Councilman Pettigano announced the Harvest Day at Borough Field and the upcoming Halloween Party at the Recreation Center. He discussed the new banners at the high school.

Councilman Colletti stated there have only been minor calls for the Fire Department recently. He discussed the EPFD testing the fire hydrants. He also discussed the JIF and the amount of accident claims.

Mr. Randazzo had no report.

Mayor Mola discussed the de-snagging and dredging of Fleischer's Brook. The Mayor further discussed the paving of the Boulevard and the resolution endorsing the Route 80 improvements which could include sound barriers. The Mayor discussed the settlement of the lawsuit with the former Building Inspector John Buonanno in the amount of \$450,000. Mr. Randazzo cautioned the Mayor that the matter had not been settled and should not be discussed in public. The Mayor retracted the statement and added that pension credits in the settlement are still being discussed.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Lenore Madrachimov, Echo Place, discussed the property on Cadmus Avenue and why ordinances are not being enforced regarding this property and other properties. She provided emails which were sent to the Clerk's Office and discussed various issues concerning the properties in question.

Shakib Fakhoury, Washington Avenue, stated that EP United applied for field usage five years ago and the group needed to hire a lawyer as they have had issues getting permits. He discussed some of the Council Members who campaigned on issues at Cherry Hill Park which is the field EP United was given permission to use. He raised concerns about the use of Mosquito Jungle and the conditions of the field.

Mike Rizzuto, Orchard Street, discussed his son playing on EP Rec'ing Crew and that the program had five to six fields to utilize. Now his son is on EP United and they are not given any fields to use.

Daniel Golabek, 44 Godwin Avenue, addressed the Mayor's literature which claimed an incorrect number relative to the increase in school taxes. The Mayor indicated that it would be retracted in the next paper. Mr. Golabek expressed concern about making sure numbers printed are correct. He stated it places the Board of Education in an undue bind and it is unfair to the Board.

James D'Amico, Willow Street, asked Mr. Golabek what the right numbers are with regarding to the increase Board of Education taxes. He stated the Mayor and Council had a 0% tax increase. He discussed other concerns regarding the school district and the increase in the school tax.

Richard Trawinski, Walnut Street, stated he is running for Mayor and discussed the minutes from the Library Board meeting. He asked whether the minutes reference a squirrel in the Library. He discussed the joint meeting with the Library Board and the instance with the squirrel. He indicated he had correspondence with the Library Board Chairman and should someone be injured by the squirrel that the town and the Library Board Trustees would be liable. He asked the Borough Attorney whether as a Trustee of the Library Board if he would be personally liable. Mr. Randazzo stated that if it was a known issue and action was not taken to correct the problem then there would be liability. The Mayor stated there have not been any issues with squirrels since August. Mr. Trawinski disagreed.

Azid (inaudible), Florence Place, asked about why is child can't use the field. Borough Attorney Randazzo stated due to pending litigation the Mayor and Council are unable to speak on this topic.

Tom Conboy, Tuella Avenue, asked about the surplus in the budget. Council President Dombrowski stated \$2 million. Mr. Conboy asked about the litigation regarding the Building Inspector and why discussed in public without having been settled. He asked whether the Library RFP was received by the Council. Mr. Kazmark indicated it was. He discussed the lawn sign which was placed on his relatives' property on Lincoln Avenue without permission. Mr. Conboy discussed the attendance of the Republican Council candidates at meetings. He discussed the placement of the tank on Market Street and Boulevard. Mr. Conboy addressed the grant for Cherry Hill Park and whether it will come to fruition. He addressed the funding within the Recreation Trust Account and stated the Cherry Hill project should be done. He also discussed the hockey rink project being completed.

Lenore Madrachimov, Echo Place, stated that one of the pictures she provided was of Cherry Hill Park. She believes someone used weed killer on the hill and raised concerns about it. She stated Mosquito Jungle is a catch basin.

Robert Colon, Parkview Avenue, indicated he is a Council candidate and Director on the Elmwood Park Chamber of Commerce. He asked about the Inform newspaper and the reference to the Chamber of Commerce backing him and his running mates. He stated that is not true. Discussion ensued between Mr. Colon and the Mayor regarding the matter. Mr. Colon announced an upcoming event for a Gotta Dance employee who has been diagnosed with breast cancer.


