

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the attention of the Mayor and Council that many borough employees rely on the Summer Camp Program offered by the Recreation Department for child care; and

All Borough of Elmwood Park Employees shall receive a \$50.00(fifty) discount on the Summer Camp program offered by the Recreation Department.





SECTION 1:







BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE RESURFACING OF IOZIA TERRACE, FRANKLIN STREET AND COURT STREET IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$150,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake the resurfacing of Iozia Terrace, Franklin Street and Court Street (including drainage improvements and curb and sidewalk replacement, where necessary), in, by and for said Borough. It is hereby determined and stated that said roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 2. The sum of \$150,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. It is anticipated that a grant from the Bergen County Community Development Program, pursuant to the Federal Housing and Community Development Act, shall be received by the Borough to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof. Any of said grant funds so received shall be applied as set forth in Section 10 hereof. Said improvements

shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law, and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$150,000, and (4) \$8,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$142,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$31,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$8,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$8,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$142,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$142,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its

reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$142,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in

the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.



AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE III, CHAPTER 34-3 OF CHAPTER XXXIV OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK ENTITLED "DEFINITIONS AND WORD USAGE."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Article III, Chapter 34-3 of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park entitled "Definition and Word Usage" is hereby amended by deleting the existing definition of "Deck" and replacing it with the following

Deck shall mean any outdoor raised platform on a dwelling creating an area used for walking, sitting, eating or any other outdoor activities with steps leading down to the ground, located in the rear of the dwelling, are uncovered and having a maximum surface area of two hundred (200) square feet. The percentage area of any deck which exceeds the maximum surface provision of this definition shall be included in the total lot area covered by the main building.

Decks placed at the same level as the finished first floor elevation and less than six (6) feet above the lowest ground surface along the perimeter of the platform, shall be permitted on residential dwellings subject to compliance with the following provisions: (iii) minimum rear yard setback of six (6) feet; (iv) minimum side yard setback of six (6) feet.

Decks placed above the finished first floor elevation or more than six (6) feet above the lowest ground surface along the perimeter of the platform, shall be permitted on residential dwellings subject to compliance with the following provisions: (i) minimum rear yard setback of ten (10) feet; (ii) minimum side yard setback of ten (10) feet.

SECTION 2: Repealer

All Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that same are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3: Invalid Provisions



BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE 2015 ROAD RESURFACING PROGRAM IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$510,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake the 2015 Road Resurfacing Program at various locations (including drainage improvements and curb, sidewalk and crosswalk replacement, where necessary), as set forth on a list on file with the Borough Clerk and hereby approved and incorporated herein by this reference thereto. Depending upon the contract price and other exigent circumstances, and upon approval by the Borough Council, there may be additions to or deletions from the aforesaid list. It is hereby determined and stated that the roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 2. The sum of \$510,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law, and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$510,000, and (4) \$25,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$485,000, and (6)

the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$82,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$25,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$25,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$485,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$485,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any

matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$485,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough,

and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.




Dear Members of the Council:

I, Richard A. Mola, Mayor of the Borough of Elmwood Park, do hereby exercise my right of veto, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 60-5 et. Seq. And applicable New Jersey Law, Ordinance number 15-08.

In accordance with subsection (D.) Of said statute, I hereby set forth the following reasons for my veto:

1. The public should be aware of all applications presented before the Planning Board so they may comment on the application and find out if and how it may affect them. This is called transparency.
2. If this ordinance is passed, the Zoning Officer will review the application behind closed doors in his office without public input. It will not have a tape recorder or court reporter for public record of what is said, nor will the applicant be sworn in and testify under oath.
3. If the application is heard before the Planning Board, it will have 9 members of the board, the Engineer, and the Board Attorney present. That is 22 eyes and ears to review and ask questions, not just one man, the Zoning Officer.
4. All members of the Planning Board are residents of Elmwood Park and know our Community. The Zoning Officer doesn't have to live in Elmwood Park and is not as familiar with our town.
5. The Council had a meeting with the Planning Board to review this proposed ordinance. All Planning Board members attended and all are against this ordinance.
6. This ordinance places an unnecessary burden on the shared service of our Zoning Officer.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilman Caramagna reported on the new traffic light at the Broadway train station. He discussed that it has taken a long time, but is finally done. He further reported on the builder for the Board of Education discussing the construction costs at a recent school board meeting. He discussed the Library Board meeting which he attended and addressed the need for the Library to be fixed up. He proposed waiting to expand the library. He is not against the library; he is for the improvements and the need to make it look better. He is for the children. The Mayor asked whether Councilman Caramagna is for the expansion of the library. The Councilman stated he is in favor of having a beautiful library. Discussion between the Mayor and Councilman Caramagna ensued.

Council President Dombrowski discussed the Board of Health rabies clinic held yesterday. The Council President discussed the Library Board's decision to spend the money in the capital fund to fix the library building. He addressed the accusations of politics regarding this issue. He clarified that he never asked the library to refund the money in the capital fund to the taxpayer. He stated he wants to see something happen at the library which includes fixing it and adding square footage. Work needs to start in 2016. He asked everyone to remember our fallen soldiers this Memorial Day.

Councilman Vuoncino discussed the Library Boards position stated in the newspaper today regarding \$38 being "insignificant" to the taxpayers of Elmwood Park. He stated this money was set aside to make improvements to the library and will benefit the children for years to come. These funds should have been used all along to maintain the building, not to play catch up. Councilman Vuoncino discussed the need for a plan, which he conveyed to the Board at a meeting earlier this year. He further asked to contact the state to get a handle on the need for technology and library resources. The Councilman stated that the Board should be telling the architect what the needs are for our community at the library. He discussed the need for a joint meeting with the Library Board and the Mayor and Council to discuss the needs for the improvements. He discussed the NJ SEM auction results. Councilman Vuoncino announced the EPPD Junior Police Academy to be held this summer. He reported on a recent Police visit to a child hospitalized at Hackensack Hospital. He congratulated all the college graduates and discussed his children and their recent accomplishments.

Councilman Martino discussed the veto override from the Council concerning the CCO ordinance.

Councilman Pettigano invited everyone to Community Day. He announced the Movie Nights in the Recreation Center Gym. He announced the Spray Park season and reported that 300 children are signed up for summer camp. Councilman Pettigano discussed his concern about the Library. He feels the maintenance should have been kept up with like people do to their homes. He discussed the amount of people who use the library and if it was cleaner and better kept more people may use it. He thanked our Veteran's with Memorial Day approaching.

Councilman Colletti discussed the library capital fund of \$1.7 million and that the money is there and any improvements will not be on the back of the taxpayers. He invited everyone to the Fire Department Memorial Day services. The EPPD is seeking new volunteers. He reported on the JIF claims based on a previous meeting.

Jeff Freitag, Hillman Drive, inquired about the amount of patrons who utilize the library services. Council President Dombrowski stated the number is over 2,800. Mr. Freitag discussed people crossing at the new traffic light at the Broadway station and what he recently observed.

Kenneth Arabia, Locust Street thanked the Mayor for opening a food store on this side of town. He further discussed the DPW digging up his yard and not placing grass seed. He also discussed a tree growing on the roof.

The Mayor stated there are 9,000 library card holders in town. Council President Dombrowski compared the library card holders to registered voters. Not all vote and not all use the library.

A motion was made by Council President Dombrowski and seconded by Councilman Colletti to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
