

SECTION IV: LONGEVITY

1. A full-time employee shall be entitled to longevity pay based in the following schedule:

Completion of the third year to completion of the fifth year	1%
Beginning of the sixth year to the completion of the eighth year	2%
Beginning of the ninth year to the completion of the eleventh year	3%
Beginning of the twelfth year to the completion of the fourteenth year	4%
Beginning of the fifteenth year to the completion of the twentieth year	5%
Beginning of the twenty-first year to the completion of the twenty-fourth year	6%
Beginning of the twenty-fifth year	8%

2. Any employee hired after January 1, 2007 shall not be entitled to longevity.

3. Such payments shall be added to each employee's base annual salary.
4. The anniversary date for payroll purposes only of all employees of the Borough of Elmwood Park after having completed one full year employment shall be January 1.

SECTION V: SICK LEAVE

1. All full-time employees shall be compensated annually for up to (15) days absence from work by reason of illness. All sick leave shall be accumulated and any unused portion thereof shall be applied towards future illness.

SECTION VI: HOLIDAY & PERSONAL DAYS

1. All Borough employees for who there is provided herein an annual compensation shall be excused from the performance of their duties with continuance of pay on the following days:

New Year's Day	Martin Luther King Jr. Birthday
Lincoln's Birthday*	Washington's Birthday
Good Friday	Memorial Day
Independence Day	Labor Day
Columbus Day	General Election Day
Veteran's Day	Thanksgiving Day

	(8) Personal Days – Designated Department Heads Only (Effective January 1, 2015)

2. *Floater Holiday
3. In the event that a holiday falls on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be observed as the holiday. In the event that a holiday falls on a Saturday, the preceding Friday shall be observed as the holiday.
4. This section shall not apply to part time employees whom are compensated on an hourly basis.

SECTION VII: VACATION

1. All full-time employees shall be allowed vacation leave from their employment with continuance of compensation provided herein, in accordance with the following schedule:

One through five years of service	12 days
Completion of the fifth year to ten years of service	12 days plus one day per year for each up to 17 days
Completion of ten years of service	21 days
Completion of twelve years of service	22 days
Completion of fourteen years of service	23 days
Completion of sixteen years of service	24 days
Completion of eighteen years of service	25 days
completion of twenty years of service and thereafter	30 days

2. All employees hired after January 1, 2007 cannot accumulate vacation days other than accrued days from (1) year prior.

SECTION VIII: TERMINAL LEAVE

1. All employees hired prior to January 1, 1991 that desire to enter into retirement shall receive terminal leave immediately prior to said retirement provided said employee

notified the Borough prior to February 15th of the year he/she intends to retire. PERS will then be notified and the retirement application of the employee will be processed. Such leaves shall be computed at the following rate:

1 to 7 years	1 month
8 to 14 years	2 months
15 to 21 years	3 months
22 years and over	4 months

- In addition to leave granted above, each employee shall receive enumeration for ½ of all accumulated sick days from January 1, 1962 immediately prior to retirement of such employee with a maximum accumulation of 120 working days.
- All employees hired on or after January 1, 1991, shall receive the following terminal leave:

After 10 years of service	1 month
After 20 years of service	2 months

- Each employee shall receive his terminal leave payment as a lump sum payment as of the last day of the performance of duty before commencement of his terminal leave.

SECTION IX: SICK/VACATION DAYS FOR FULL TIME CROSSING GUARDS

- All full time crossing guards shall receive 10 sick/vacation days per school year, September through June. At the end of the school year, all full time crossing guards will receive an additional pay of \$25.00 per day for each sick/vacation day not used during the school year.

SECTION X: REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES

- All prior Department Head, Non-Union and Part Time Salary Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.





BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to acquire new additional or replacement equipment and machinery and a new fire rescue vehicle and a new automotive vehicle, including original apparatus and equipment, in, by and for said Borough, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough.

Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (3) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (4) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

Section 5. The cost of such purposes, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$9,200 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 6. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$16,200, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$16,200 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 7. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$320,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 8. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$320,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 9. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 10. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 9.36 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 11. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$320,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 12. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 13. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 14. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 15. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 16. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

Section 2. The sum of \$209,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvement described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). 4. Supplemental fee: when a supplemental or duplicate billing notice is required, there will be an additional charge of \$25.00 added to the basic fee listed above.

b. R-A uses shall be inspected and charged a fee only upon sale or change of tenant.

c. Uses not classified above that are subject to the Uniform Fire Code will be classified as business uses.

d. Uses required to register with the State as life hazard uses shall not be required to register under this section.

e. In the discretion of the Fire Official, vacant buildings will be charged and inspected according to the previous use of the building.

f. All residential uses except R-A uses shall be inspected in the common areas only.







the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$455,200, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$72,060 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$22,800, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$22,800 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$455,200 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$455,200 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or

Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$455,200 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

WHEREAS, Congress authorized the 1033 Program to make use of excess Department of Defense (DoD) equipment by making it available at the local, county, and state level. This excess DoD equipment has been purchased with taxpayer funds. Law enforcement may request resources from this program. The Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) mandates that all acquired 1033 equipment be under the control of the requesting law enforcement agency. The equipment may enhance community preparedness, response, and resiliency while off-setting the costs in a time of fiscal constraints; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 2364 2(a) requires that all local or county law enforcement agencies be approved by resolution by the majority of the full membership of the governing body prior to the transmittal of 1033 Program Application. The DLA requires that applications for program participation be submitted every 365 days; and

WHEREAS, the Elmwood Park Mayor and Council (also herein referred to as the "Council" requires that the designated Law Enforcement Support Offices (LESO) Point of Contact for this venue submit a monthly report regarding acquired 1033 Program property to the Chief Executive Official of the venue. In the event that any property had been obtained contrary to the intent of Senate Bill No. 2364 2(a), the State Coordinator shall be contacted and equipment shall be transferred or returned via the federal inventory database system (FEPMIS); and

WHEREAS, the Elmwood Park Mayor and Council finds that the Elmwood Park Police Department may request and acquire certain DEMIL B though H (controlled) property in the RTD system without restriction and additional resolutions from the Council. However, it has been determined that based on the Elmwood Park Police Department's needs, it may not acquire armored tactical vehicles, marine vessels over 28 feet, aircraft, weapons, or any items deemed without approval of the governing body. Any special application for weapons, aircraft or MRAP's must be authorized by the Council by resolution prior to the submission of the application/requisition; and

WHEREAS, the Elmwood Park Mayor and Council shall have complete oversight of the Elmwood Park Police Department's participation in the Department of Defense-Defense Logistics Agency- Law Enforcement Support Office/1033 Program and of any and all items obtained from the program; and


