

**BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK  
ORDINANCE 17-21**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND** Chapter 3 of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park titled "Police Regulations" by amending Sections 3-8.1 thereof.

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park as follows:

**Section 1.** Ordinance 3-8.1 titled "PROHIBITED PARKING" is hereby amended to read as follows:

**3-8.1 Prohibited Parking.**

The owner or operator of a vehicle shall not stop, stand or park the vehicle in a roadway other than parallel with the edge of the roadway headed in the direction of traffic, on the right-hand side of the road. All four tires must be on the paved portion of the roadway and with the curb side of the vehicle within six inches of the edge of the roadway, except as follows:

a. Upon those streets which have been designated by ordinance and have been marked or signed for angle parking, vehicles shall be parked at the angle to the curb designated and indicated by the ordinance and marks or signs.

b. Upon one-way streets, local authorities may permit parking of vehicles parallel with the left-hand edge of the roadway headed in the direction of traffic, on the left-hand side of the road and with the curb side of the vehicle within six inches of the edge of the roadway.

Parking of motor vehicles on lawns, yards or landscaped areas is prohibited.

**Section 2.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed or amended to the extent of such inconsistency.

**Section 3.** This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

**BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK  
ORDINANCE 17-22**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND** the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park, Chapter XXXIV thereof, entitled "Zoning and Site Plan Review" by amending Section 34-3.1 "Definitions" to add a definition for Nightclub or Club.

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park as follows:

**Section 1.** Chapter XXXIV "Zoning and Site Plan Review" of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park, and specifically section 34-3.1 thereof titled "Definitions" is hereby amended by adding the following:

**NIGHTCLUB or CLUB:** Venues or establishments offering live entertainment of any kind, with or without food service, with or without the service of alcohol will be considered nightclubs or clubs.

The term Nightclub includes:

1. Places of entertainment open late at night, offering live music and/or dancing, and/or drinks and sometimes serving food;
2. An entertainment venue which conducts its primary business after dark, at night, after normal restaurant or business operating hours.
3. Establishments which hold events where entertainment would not normally be considered an accessory use to the principal permitted use.
4. Establishments which charge admission or require the purchase of tickets or a "cover charge" for entry.

One element of a nightclub or club which will further distinguish the same is that the patrons of such an establishment will be engaged in drinking alcohol and other beverages with less emphasis on food consumption and using the services provided as part of the primary function of the facility.

Exceptions;

Charitable, Political or recognized community clubs holding special events. Special events require the approval of the Mayor and Council.

A use accessory to a restaurant will not be considered a nightclub only when all of the following conditions are met:

- (1) Where the area permanently devoted to the entertainment use is less than 20% of the gross floor area of the public portions of the restaurant, not including hallways, bars and required aisles, coat check areas, smoking areas, waiter stations and rest rooms.
- (2) Where the occupancy is limited to the number of persons for whom there are tables and chairs.
- (3) Where the restaurant continues unrestricted food service, including all advertised specials and all items on the printed menu, until closing.
- (4) Where the restaurant maintains no less than 75% of the total available seating within the establishment for restaurant patrons ordering or consuming meals.
- (5) When entertainment is provided, it is limited to acoustical, nonamplified entertainment.

Any use which is accessory to a restaurant use which does not satisfy all of the conditions described above shall cause the entire use to be defined as a "nightclub" as defined herein.

**Section 2.** If any part of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance.

**Section 3.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed or amended to the extent of such inconsistency.

**Section 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

#### **SECTION IV: LONGEVITY**

Beginning of the twelfth year to the completion of the fourteenth year	4%
Beginning of the fifteenth year to the completion of the twentieth year	5%
Beginning of the twenty-first year to the completion of the twenty-fourth year	6%
Beginning of the twenty-fifth year	8%

2. Any employee hired after January 1, 2007 shall not be entitled to longevity.
3. Such payments shall be added to each employee's base annual salary.

- The anniversary date for payroll purposes only of all employees of the Borough of Elmwood Park after having completed one full year employment shall be January 1.

**SECTION V: SICK LEAVE**

- All full-time employees shall be compensated annually for up to (15) days absence from work by reason of illness. All sick leave shall be accumulated and any unused portion thereof shall be applied towards future illness.

**SECTION VI: HOLIDAY & PERSONAL DAYS**

- All Borough employees for who there is provided herein an annual compensation shall be excused from the performance of their duties with continuance of pay on the following days:

**SECTION VII: VACATION**

- All full-time employees shall be allowed vacation leave from their employment with continuance of compensation provided herein, in accordance with the following schedule:

One through five years of service	12 days
Completion of the fifth year to ten years of service	12 days plus one day per year for each up to 17 days
Completion of ten years of service	21 days
Completion of twelve years of service	22 days
Completion of fourteen years of service	23 days
Completion of sixteen years of service	24 days
Completion of eighteen years of service	25 days
completion of twenty years of service and thereafter	30 days

- All employees hired after January 1, 2007 cannot accumulate vacation days other than accrued days from (1) year prior.

**SECTION VIII: TERMINAL LEAVE**

- All employees hired prior to January 1, 1991 that desire to enter into retirement shall receive terminal leave immediately prior to said retirement provided said employee notified the Borough prior to February 15<sup>th</sup> of the year he/she intends to retire. PERS will then be notified and the retirement application of the employee will be processed. Such leaves shall be computed at the following rate:

1 to 7 years	1 month
8 to 14 years	2 months
15 to 21 years	3 months
22 years and over	4 months

- In addition to leave granted above, each employee shall receive enumeration for ½ of all accumulated sick days from January 1, 1962 immediately prior to retirement of such employee with a maximum accumulation of 120 working days.

- Each employee shall receive his terminal leave payment as a lump sum payment as of the last day of the performance of duty before commencement of his terminal leave.

- All full time crossing guards shall receive 10 sick/vacation days per school year, September through June. At the end of the school year, all full time crossing guards will receive an additional pay of \$25.00 per day for each sick/vacation day not used during the school year.



Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to acquire new additional or replacement equipment and machinery and a new fire rescue vehicle and a new automotive vehicle, including original apparatus and equipment, in, by and for said Borough, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough.

Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (3) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (4) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

Section 5. The cost of such purposes, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$9,200 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 6. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$16,200, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$16,200 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 7. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$320,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 8. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$320,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 9. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 10. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 9.36 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 11. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$320,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 12. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.


Section 13. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.



BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK REMOVAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION AT THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS YARD IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$209,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake underground storage tank removal and environmental remediation at the Department of Public Works Yard in, by and for said Borough. Said improvement shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. The sum of \$209,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvement described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvement shall be made as a general improvement and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvement is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3)

the estimated cost of said purpose is \$209,000, and (4) \$10,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$199,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$9,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$10,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$10,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$199,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$199,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this

ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of fifteen years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law

has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$199,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvement described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.





**AUTHORIZE SHARED SERVICE AGREEMENT  
BEFORE/AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM  
ELMWOOD PARK BOARD OF EDUCATION**

**WHEREAS**, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, et seq., authorized local units of the State of New Jersey to enter into an agreement with any other local unit or units to provide or receive any service that each local unit in the participating in the agreement is empowered to provide or receive in its own jurisdiction; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Elmwood Park (hereafter also referred to as "Borough") and Elmwood Park Board of Education (hereafter also referred to as "Board of Education") have negotiated an agreement for a Before/After Care Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the terms and conditions of this undertaking are set below; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Elmwood Park and the Elmwood Park Board of Education in an effort to more economically and efficiently provide governmental services, the governing bodies have each duly authorized their proper officials to enter into and execute this agreement.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises hereafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:


1. The Borough shall be responsible for the hiring, paying, bookkeeping, collecting, etc. associated with the day-to-day operation of the morning care and after care services.
2. The Board of Education shall permit the Borough to use the Board of Education facilities located at the various schools, during the hours of 7:30a.m. to 8:30a.m. Monday through Friday during the school year. The program will not operate during emergency closings due to weather, when there is a delayed opening or on any days that schools are closed.
3. All staff that are provided by the Borough for this program agree to provide the necessary supervision and administration inherent in providing this program. Prior to the commencement of employment, all staff will submit to a criminal background check/fingerprinting either at their own expense or at the expense of the Borough, the results of which shall be provided upon request of the Board.
4. The Borough shall operate the program in compliance with all State laws and codes. Staff to include child ratios shall meet New Jersey licensing requirements.
5. The Borough agrees to maintain in full force and effect comprehensive liability insurance, and name the Board of Education as an additional insured for this program. Additionally, the Borough shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Board of Education collectively and individually for any act of omission arising out of or in the course of the performance of the duties associated with the operation of the morning care and after care program which results in a claim by a third party.
6. The Board of Education shall not receive any funds and/or compensation from the program.
7. The Borough of Elmwood Park shall be designated as the "lead agency" under this agreement.
8. This agreement shall be effective commencing September 1, 2017 and shall expire on June 30, 2018. However, either party has the right to terminate this agreement for any reason on ninety (90) days written notice to the other party following the adoption of a resolution by the governing body of the entity authorizing the termination. In the event that either party defaults in the performance of any of its obligations under this agreement after receiving written notice of same and failing to cure such default within thirty (30)

days of said written notice, the non-defaulting party shall be entitled to terminate this agreement.

9. This agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the Borough of Elmwood Park and the Elmwood Park Board of Education and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, and/or agreements either written or oral. This agreement shall not be mended, modified or altered during the terms hereof except upon mutual agreements of the parties expressed in writing and signed with the same formality as this agreement.
10. This agreement is conditioned upon approval of the Division of Local Government Services and the Department of Community Affairs if and to the extent such approval may be required by law or regulation.
