



BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1:

Whereas, the Borough is of the opinion that it is in the best interest of the Borough to delete the bus stop at Market Street and Terrace Avenue; and

Whereas, the Borough has been advised that the County of Bergen requires a Resolution by the Mayor and Council requesting that the bus stop be deleted from the Borough Traffic Code.

Now therefore, it is resolved:

1. The the bus stop at Market Street and Terrace Avenue shall be deleted once the County and any other agency required to approve the deletion has approved the deletion.



SECTION 1: Chapter VII of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park titled "Traffic" is hereby amended by deleting the existing Section 7-13.1 titled "No Parking Anytime," as it relates to **Magnolia Street only** and replacing it with the following:

§7-813.1 "NO PARKING ANYTIME"



BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE UNDERTAKING OF VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS TO THE INTERSECTION OF MARKET STREET AND MOLA BOULEVARD IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$173,400 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake various improvements to the intersection of Market Street and Mola Boulevard (work being undertaken by the County of Bergen) in, by and for said Borough. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. The sum of \$173,400 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$173,400, and (4) \$8,400 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$165,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$15,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$8,400, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$8,400 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$165,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$165,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$165,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.



An Ordinance of the Borough of Elmwood Park in Bergen County, State of New Jersey, Amending Section 2-27 entitled "Police Department" of the Borough of Elmwood Park General Ordinances to add Subsection 27.26 to be entitled "Outside Employment of Off-Duty Police Officers"

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park (the "Borough") has permitted private contractors to retain the services of off-duty police officers to provide police officer services; and

WHEREAS, in order to ensure that the Borough is paid for these services, and that assignments to outside contractors do not conflict with the needs of the Borough, it is appropriate to establish hourly rates and procedures to be followed by private contractors and the Borough of Elmwood Park Police Department,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park as follows:

Section 2-27 entitled "Police Department" of Chapter 2 entitled "POLICE DEPARTMENT", of the Borough of Elmwood Park General Ordinances is hereby amended to add Subsection 27.26 entitled "Outside Employment of Off-Duty Police Officers" as follows:

§2-27.26.

Outside Employment of Off-Duty Police Officers.

1. Police Officers may work for outside private contractors and entities on their off-duty hours with the approval of and provided the Chief of Police determines, in his discretion, that there are sufficient police personnel available, that the outside employment assignment will not interfere with the needs of the Borough, and that sufficient funds have been deposited in an escrow account with the Borough Chief Financial Officer to cover the anticipated costs of such off-duty assignments. The Borough's Chief Financial Officer shall remit invoices to all outside private contractors and entities upon notification from the Police Chief on all outside employment.
2. The Borough has established an escrow account dedicated to the payment of off-duty police officers for outside employment by private contractors or private entities. Any prospective contractor or private entity must apply to the Chief of Police, requesting off-duty police services. The Chief of Police will then notify the Borough Clerk and Chief Financial Officer of the request and forward to them the completed application, when received. The written application shall include the following information:
3. The dates that off-duty police services and police vehicle(s) will be needed.
4. An estimate of the number of hours the contractor or private entity anticipates using the off-duty police officer(s) and, if appropriate, police vehicles.
5. A check to cover the cost of off-duty police services and use of any Borough vehicles based on the estimated number of hours shall be submitted before the start of off-duty employment in accordance with state and Division of Local Government services regulations. No police officer shall work off-duty for any private contractor or entity prior to clearance of the funds in the escrow account.
 - a. If the contractor's or private entity's needs exceed the estimated sum in the escrow account, the Borough's Chief Financial Officer shall immediately notify the contractor or outside entity that the funds in the escrow account are insufficient to pay for continued off-duty police services. The contractor or private entity shall then either replenish the escrow account with a check sufficient to pay for continued services or the Chief of Police shall immediately terminate provision of the off-duty police services to the contractor or private entity.
 - b. If the contractor's or private entity's estimated costs exceed the actual costs incurred, then the Borough shall, upon proper notice to the Borough Chief Financial Officer, refund the remainder of the escrow account.

6. Rates for off-duty police services are:

- a. The rate of pay for off-duty police work charged to private contractors and entities, for either security or traffic control, is \$75 an hour.
- b. The rate of pay charged to private entity performing work for or pursuant to a contract for services with the Borough of Elmwood Park is \$60 an hour.
- c. The rate of pay charged to Public and Private Schools and not-for-profit organizations or corporations located in Elmwood Park or staging events in Elmwood Park is \$50 an hour.

d. All off-duty work officers will be guaranteed a minimum of 4 hours of work and will be compensated for any fraction of in quarter hour increments, or whole hour, thereafter. The failure of a contractor or private entity to contact the Police Department at least 3 hours in advance of the start of an assignment to cancel the request for off-duty police services will result in the 4 hour minimum charge to the contractor or private entity.

e. An addition to the amounts noted above, a per hour Administrative Fee of \$45 for traffic duty and \$15 per hour Administrative Fee for Security detail will be charged to the contractor or private entity which includes a Borough Police vehicle.

7. Whenever a contractor or outside entity contracts with the Borough Police Department for the services of a police officer during his or her off-duty hours to engage in police-related activities, that outside entity must first:

- a. Indemnify and hold the Borough harmless from and against any and all losses, claims, damages or expenses, including reasonable attorney fees, arising from the performance of police-related duties by such off-duty Borough police officer on behalf of such entity. Such indemnity agreement shall be in a form acceptable to the Borough Attorney.
- b. Provide the Borough, prior to utilization of the Borough police officer, with a certificate of insurance from a company authorized to do business in the State of New Jersey evidencing workers' compensation coverage, personal liability and comprehensive general liability with policy limits of not less than one million (\$1,000,000) dollars and property damage liability coverage of not less than three hundred thousand (\$300,000) dollars. Such policies shall name the Borough as an additional insured and shall remain in effect during the entire period that the officer is employed by the outside entity.

8. In the event a contractor determines not to use off-duty police officers, the contractor must provide for their own traffic control and signage unless the Chief of Police or the Borough determines that the contractor must utilize off-duty police officers for safety purposes. In no event does this provision preclude the Chief of Police from using on-duty police officers, at any time, to perform these functions.

9. All other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency. In the event of any inconsistencies between the provisions of this Ordinance and any prior ordinance of the Borough of Elmwood Park, the provisions hereof shall be determined to govern. All other parts, portions and provisions of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof.

10. If any article, section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance and they shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared severable.

11. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed or amended to the extent of such inconsistency.

12. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE # 18-05

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE RESURFACING OF PORTIONS OF FRANKLIN STREET, ORCHARD STREET AND LEE STREET IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$240,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake the resurfacing of portions of Franklin Street, Orchard Street and Lee Street (including construction of ADA handicapped access curb ramps and drainage improvements, where necessary) in, by and for said Borough. It is hereby determined and stated that said roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 2. The sum of \$240,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. It is anticipated that a \$124,351 grant from the Bergen County Community Development Program, pursuant to the Federal Housing and Community Development Act, shall be received by the Borough to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof. Any of said grant funds so received shall be applied as set forth in Section 10 hereof. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law, and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$240,000, and (4) \$12,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$228,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$40,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$12,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$12,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$228,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$228,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$228,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.


Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.



AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND Sections of ORDINANCE 2-2 of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park titled "POLICE DEPARTMENT" by amending Sections 2-27.11, 2-27.21 and 2-27.22.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park as follows:

Section 1. Sections 2-27.11, 2-27.21 and 2-27.22 shall be deleted and replaced with the following:

2-27.11 Disciplinary Hearings.

(a) In any investigation of a police officer that results in disciplinary charges, which charges seek to suspend, demote or terminate a permanent police officer on charges that the officer has violated one or more of the provisions of N.J.A.C. 4A:2-2.3, or violation of the internal rules and regulations of the Police Department, or any state statute, or the implicit standard of good conduct, and the police officer requests a hearing, the Appropriate Authority, or its designee, shall sit as Hearing Officer for the Borough.

(b) In the event the Appropriate Authority does not act as Hearing Officer, the Appropriate Authority may appoint, via resolution, any individual it deems qualified, appropriate and in the best interests of the Borough to serve as Hearing Officer. The Hearing Officer designated to hear the disciplinary matter shall, at the conclusion of the hearing, forward his/her findings and recommendations to the Appropriate Authority, who shall make the final determination. The Appropriate Authority's decision shall be reviewable in accordance with civil service law and regulations, as may be amended from time to time, as provided in N.J.S.A. 11A:1-1, et seq. and N.J.A.C. 4A:2-1, et. seq.

2-27.21 Appeals from Penalties.

See 2-27.11 (b).

2-27.22 Misconduct Observed by Police Personnel.


Whenever any member observes, or is informed of, the misconduct of another member or employee, he or she shall render a complete written report of the incident to the Chief of Police, through the chain of command.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed or amended to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.



Drugs and Alcohol Policy (rev. 4/2018)

The Borough recognizes that the possession or use of unlawful drugs and the abuse of alcohol pose a threat to the health and safety of all employees. Any employee who is observed by a supervisor or department head to be intoxicated or under the influence of alcohol or drugs during working hours or is under reasonable suspicion of same shall be immediately tested and is subject to discipline up to and including termination. The supervisor or Department Head will immediately report any reasonable suspicions to the Municipal Clerk.

An employee will be required to submit to alcohol, drug or controlled substance testing when the employee's work performance causes a reasonable suspicion that that employee is impaired due to current intoxication, drug or controlled substance use or in cases where employment has been conditioned upon remaining alcohol, drug, or controlled dangerous substance free following treatment. Refusal to submit to testing when requested may result in immediate disciplinary action, including termination. Supervisors or Department Heads that observe behavior constituting reasonable suspicion are required to institute testing and do not have the option of sending the employee home as an alternative.

The manufacturing, distribution, dispensation, possession, and use of alcohol or unlawful drugs on Borough premises or during work hours by employees is strictly prohibited.

Employees must notify their supervisor within five (5) days of conviction for a drug or alcohol related violation, whether or not the violation occurred in the workplace.

Employees who are required to maintain a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) are subject to random drug testing as required by the federal government.

Employees using prescription drugs that may affect job performance or safety must notify their Department Head, Municipal Clerk, or other designee who is required to maintain the confidentiality of any information regarding an employee's medical condition in accordance with the Health Insurance Portability and Protection Act. Borough personnel who hold a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) are subject to the provisions of the Commercial Driver's Licenses Drug and Alcohol Testing Policy. (A program to assist employees who may have a drug/alcohol problem is provided through the Borough's Employee Assistance Program.)

No prescription drug should be used by any person other than the individual to whom it is prescribed. Such substances or non-prescription (over-the-counter) drugs should be used only as prescribed or indicated. Employees are prohibited from consuming prescription drugs that are not prescribed in their name on Borough property or while performing Borough business. Soliciting or distributing prescription drugs for or to other employees is also strictly prohibited.

Any employee found to have violated the Drug and Alcohol Policy of the Borough of Elmwood Park shall be subject to the following:

1. 15 Day minimum suspension with a mandatory counseling requirement. A release from the counselor is required to return to work.
2. Second Offence, termination if within 5 years of prior offense.
