**STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING
THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH MORE SPECIFICALLY
CHAPTER VII ENTITLED "TRAFFIC" SECTION 7-18 ONE-
WAY STREETS.**

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Elmwood Park in the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, has determined that there is a public necessity to change the traffic flow so as to allow a more efficient traffic pattern and improve the use of street parking which requires the adoption of an ordinance to create a one way traffic flow and delete a no parking regulation and allow parking; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that there is a necessity to regulate traffic flow so as to improve traffic and utilization of more off-street parking; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park believes that these traffic regulations are necessary in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of those individuals who reside in the area, as well as the safety of the public at large.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park in the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1.

That Chapter VII, "Traffic", of the General Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park, New Jersey is hereby amended and supplemented at **Section 7-18 "One Way Streets" so as to change Roosevelt Avenue beginning at Miles Street intersection though to Bank Street intersection and same be designated as a one way street with the traffic flow moving eastbound only; and**

SECTION 2.

That Chapter VII, "Traffic", of the General Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park, New Jersey is hereby amended and supplemented at **Section 7-18 to repeal and delete the No Parking Anytime Restriction on the Northside of Roosevelt Avenue and thereby allowing parking resulting in a an increase of off street parking.**

SECTION 3.

That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with the law, subject to any approvals that may be required if necessary, by the New Jersey Department of Transportation and/or the County of Bergen.

SECTION 4.

That, upon the effective date of this Ordinance, the appropriate Borough officials and/or employees shall be authorized to post applicable signs in the affected areas.

SECTION 7.

That, upon the effective date of this Ordinance, it shall be illegal for the motoring public to make drive westbound on Roosevelt Avenue between the intersection of **Miles Street and Bank Street** and the Borough of Elmwood Police Department shall be authorized to enforce the said traffic regulations as a violation of Section 7-18, "One-Way Streets", of the General Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park, New Jersey.

SECTION 8.

In the event any section, part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, such holding shall not affect the validity of

this Ordinance or any remaining part of this Ordinance other than the part held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 9. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies.

SECTION 10.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A “4-WAY STOP” AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF ORANGE AVENUE AND MAGNOLIA STREET AND TO AMEND CHAPTER VII OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK TITLED "TRAFFIC" MORE SPECIFICALLY SECTION 7-21 TITLED “MULTI-WAY STOP INTERSECTIONS”

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have become aware of the necessity to regulate the particular four-way intersection of Orange Avenue and Magnolia Street for safety concerns of traffic and pedestrian crossing, in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Borough of Elmwood Park.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey and pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-140 of the laws of the state of New Jersey the Mayor and Council ordains as follows:

SECTION 1: That by way of this Ordinance the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park do hereby designate and establish a “4-Way Stop” at the intersections of Orange Avenue and Magnolia Street in the Borough of Elmwood Park.

SECTION 2: The designated “4-Way Stop” is in the interest of the public and its health, safety and welfare and the inhabitants in and near said intersection.

SECTION 3: The responsible department of the Borough of Elmwood Park shall be responsible and directed through the Borough Administrator to install the necessary “4-Way Stop” signs at the above-mentioned intersection.

SECTION 4: Be it further Ordained by the Mayor and Council that Chapter VII of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park titled "Traffic" more specifically section 7-21 titled “Multi-Way Stop Intersections is hereby amended so as to include thereto the “4-Way Stop” intersection of Orange Avenue and Magnolia Street as follows:

7-21 Multi-way stop intersections.

Is hereby amended to include the “4-Way Stop” intersection of Orange Avenue and Magnolia Street. That traffic will stop in all direction.

SECTION 5: Penalties for violation. Any person who violates the provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in accordance to the respective and appropriate fine sections of the Borough of Elmwood Park and or as set forth in the Laws of the State of New Jersey.

SECTION 6: The Police Chief and the Police Department of the Borough of Elmwood Park, shall assist and enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7: Repealer. All Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that same are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3: Invalid Provisions.: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: Effective Date.: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication thereof as provide by law.
