BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK WORK MEETING October 1, 2020 7:00PM

The Work Meeting of the Elmwood Park Mayor and Council for October 1, 2020 was called to order by Municipal Clerk Erin Delaney at 7:03PM. The Statement of Compliance was read.

Councilmembers Fasolo, Golabek, Ingui, Pellegrine, Wechtler, and Council President Balistrieri were present. Also present were Mayor Colletti, Municipal Clerk Erin Delaney, Borough Administrator Michael Foligno and Borough Attorney Salvatore A. Ingraffia.

PUBLIC HEARING:

<u>1 – Best Practices Survey Review</u>

Borough CFO, Roy Riggitano, reviewed the Best Practices Inventory with the Mayor and Council. The Governing Body was pleased with the results. It was agreed upon that the Borough will come up with a social media policy for the running of their social media account on Facebook.

<u>2 – Fire Department 5 Year Plan</u>

Fire Chief Chvasta and Assistant Chief Robert Bruce discussed a Fire Department 5-year plan with the Governing Body. They asked for the Governing Body's approval to establish committees that will be able to solidify the plan and their requests. Some items of discussion included restructuring the stipend program for high ranking officers and keeping an apparatus as a back-up. No decisions were made; however, the Governing Body gave their blessing for the Department to create internal committees.

Jeffrey Freitag, Hillman Drive, stated that there must be some culpability with the Library project considering the length of time it has taken to be completed.
