AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 2 "ADMINISTRATION" MORE SPECIFICALLY ARTICLE III OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF "DEPARTMENT ELMWOOD PARK **TITLED OF** THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT." MORE SPECIFICALLY, SECTION 2-27 ENTITLED "POLICE DEPARTMENT." **MORE SPECIFICALLY SECTION 2-27.1** ENTITLED "CREATION OF THE DEPARTMENT; MEMBERS"

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have become aware of the need to streamline the police department to make the same more efficient in its operation and to protect the health and safety of the residents of the Borough of Elmwood Park.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 2, Article III of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park titled "Department of Local Government" more specifically section 2-27.1 Creation of the Department; Members, shall be amended to so as to add language to section b and add a new section intitled section c.

Section b. Shall be amended to read as follows:

In order to provide for a safe and efficient transition when a member or members of the police force give notice of their intent to retire, there shall be permitted a maximum of two additional patrol officers (in addition to the number of patrol officers set forth in Subsection a5 above) who may be employed for a maximum of six months for the purpose of training and familiarization with police procedures. The sixmonth provision shall apply to officers hired as part of the New Jersey Civil Service Commission Intergovernmental Transfer Program.

New Section c. shall be inserted to read as follows:

In order to provide for a safe and efficient transition, there shall also be a separate provision for officers hired off the New Jersey Civil Service eligibility list as a new police recruit. This provision shall permit a maximum of two additional patrol officers (in addition to the number of patrol officers set forth in Subsection a5 above) who may be employed for a maximum of ten months for the purpose of training and familiarization with police procedures.

SECTION 2: **Remaining Part Unchanged.** All of the remaining parts of the Ordinance relating to Article III, known as Department of the Local Government of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that they are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3: Invalid Provisions. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication thereof as provided by law.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Section 4 of Ordinance No. 19-15 entitled:

"BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT, NEW INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY EQUIPMENT AND NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLES, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$1,585,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS"

adopted by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough") on August 15, 2019 (the "Prior Ordinance") is hereby amended to (A)(i) increase the appropriation and estimated cost in Section 4.F. from \$1,192,500 to \$1,282,500 (an increase of \$90,000); (ii) increase the down payment appropriated in Section 4.F. from \$56,800 to \$61,300 (an increase of \$4,500); and (iii) increase the bonds and notes authorized in Section 4.F. from \$1,135,700 to \$1,221,200 (an increase of \$85,500); and (B)(i) increase the aggregate appropriation and estimated cost for Section 4 from \$1,585,000 to \$1,675,000 (an increase of \$90,000); (ii) increase the aggregate down payment appropriated for Section 4 from \$76,000 to \$80,500 (an increase of \$4,500); and (iii) increase the aggregate amount of bonds and notes authorized in Section 4 from \$1,509,000 to \$1,594,500 (an increase of \$85,500); and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (3) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (4) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

Depending upon the contract price and other exigent circumstances, and upon approval by the Borough Council, there may be additions to or deletions from the aforesaid list. It is hereby determined and stated that the roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 2. Section 5 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to increase the estimated amount of statutorily permitted expenses included in the amount appropriated from \$210,000 to \$220,000 (an increase of \$10,000), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 5. The cost of such purposes, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$220,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law."

Section 3. Section 6 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to increase the down payment appropriated from \$76,000 to \$80,500 (an increase of \$4,500), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 6. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$80,500, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$80,500 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes."

Section 4. Section 7 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to increase the amount of bonds authorized from \$1,509,000 to \$1,594,500 (an increase of \$85,500), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 7. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,594,500 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted."

Section 5. Section 8 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to increase the amount of bond anticipation notes authorized from \$1,509,000 to \$1,594,500 (an increase of \$85,500), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 8. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,594,500 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding."

Section 6. Section 10 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to increase the average period of usefulness of the purposes authorized from 9.37 years to 9.40 years (an increase of 0.03 years), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 10. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 9.40 years computed from the date of said bonds."

Section 7. Section 11 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to increase the amount of gross debt of the Borough shown on the Supplemental Debt Statement filed for the ordinance, as amended, from \$1,509,000 to \$1,594,500 (an increase of \$85,500), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 11. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$1,594,500 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law."

Section 8. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this amendatory bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 9. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

Planning Board Chairman Jeffrey Freitag and Borough Planner, Chris Colley, from Topology gave a brief review of the redevelopment plan. They discussed the process that took place for the Borough to get to the point of having the plan up for adoption this evening. Chairman Freitag noted that the Planning Board is in support of this plan. Both continuously reiterated that the plan calls for an overlay zone which only adds zoning to the area and does not take away from any current zoning.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Ingui and seconded by Councilman Fasolo to open the floor for public comment. Motion carried unanimously.

Robert Fabian, 30 Plymouth Street, Fairfield, NJ, inquired as to the meaning of "N-C" noted in the plan. Mr. Colley informed him that it stands for "Neighborhood Commercial." He asked for information on how the plan will address parking on Market Street. Mr. Fabian stated his opinion that he feels the plan may lower property values and his concern that developers will need to buy more properties. Councilman Golabek affirmed that individuals will only need to buy more properties if they are more ambitious with their development. Mr. Fabian continued to question what the affect will be on current property owners.

Jessica Brazier, Market Street, questioned whether or not her property taxes will go up as a result of the plan. Additionally, she informed the Governing Body that when her property was purchased there was a County ordinance in place, being that Market Street is a County road, that required a 50-foot setback if the building was completely demolished and rebuilt. Ms. Brazier followed up by asking whether or not this ordinance is still in place and if it will be bypassed for new development within the plan.

Maria Rivera, Van Riper Avenue, asked the Governing Body if the plan will call for business or apartments. She stated her concerns regarding renters, parking, and traffic – specifically at the light at the intersection of River and Market.

Robert Leidenfrost, Market Street, advised the Mayor and Council that he has a plan in mind that would give them the most bang for the buck.

Mayor Colletti closed the public portion.

BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK BERGEN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY ORDINANCE # 20-32

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, ADOPTING A REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR REHABILITATION OF CERTAIN PROPERTIES SITUATED ALONG MARKET STREET AND VICINITY

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, NJS.A. 40A: 12A-l, et seq., as amended (the "Redevelopment Law"), authorizes municipalities to determine whether certain parcels of land in the municipality constitute areas in need of rehabilitation or redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Redevelopment Law, the Borough Council of ("Council") of the Borough of Elmwood Park (the "Borough") on December 19, 2019, adopted a Resolution designating the Borough of Elmwood Park as an area in its entirety in need of rehabilitation pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law; and

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate and effectuate the proper use of the properties located in the Market Street area and vicinity, the Borough has determined that there is a need to develop and implement a rehabilitation/redevelopment plan for the properties located on Market Street and vicinity pursuant to the authority granted under the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A: 12A-l et seq; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body retained the services of Topology N.J. LLC, a planning firm, to prepare a Redevelopment/rehabilitation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the planning firm, Topology N.J. LLC, has prepared and submitted to the Borough Council a redevelopment/rehabilitation plan designated as "Elmwood Park Market Street Redevelopment Plan" dated September 10, 2020; and

WHEREAS, due to the conditions of the properties identified in the Rehabilitation Area and describe in the Redevelopment Plan, the Borough Council finds the specific areas as identified inclusive of Blocks and Lots of the Tax map of Elmwood Park, more identified in the Redevelopment Plan attached as exhibit "A", to be in need of Rehabilitation, and the Borough Council further finds that it is necessary to implement and adopt the proposed Redevelopment Plan prepared by Topology N.J. LLC which provides an overlay zone in need for rehabilitation situated on Market Street and areas in the vicinity of Market Street; and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Plan, dated September 10, 2020 is on file with the Borough Clerk and provides the redevelopment/rehabilitation standards for the Property, including but not limited to the goals and objectives as setforth and stipulated in the Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, the Land Use Law the Planning Board shall review the Redevelopment Plan and transmit its comments relating to the Redevelopment Plan to the Borough Council in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7 of the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law; and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of the comments of the Planning Board relating to the Redevelopment Plan, the Borough Council will adopt the Redevelopment Plan determining that the adoption of the Redevelopment Plan is in the best interest of the Borough of Elmwood Park and its residence.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.

Section 2. The Redevelopment Plan dated September 10, 2020 and attached hereto as (Exhibit "A") and made a part hereof, is hereby adopted pursuant to the terms of NJ.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et. Seq. of the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law.

Section 3. The Borough Council hereby finds and determines that pursuant to the Redevelopment Plan, that there may be a need the designation of a Developer or Redeveloper, should same be needed the Developer or Redeveloper shall execute a Redevelopment Agreement, and all other documents necessary to bring the project to completion. Accordingly, a site plan and subdivision review shall be filed by the designated redeveloper with the Elmwood Park Planning Board, prepared within the requirements of the Municipal Land Use Law N.J.S.A. 40:55D-1 et. Seq. in order for the Redevelopment Plan to be effectuated.

Section 4. Should it be necessary the Governing Body may transfer or sell any municipal property pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 12A-8 g. and or lease or convey property or improvements to any other party pursuant to this section, without public bidding and at such prices and upon such terms as it deems reasonable, provided that the lease or conveyance is made in conjunction with a redevelopment plan, notwithstanding the provisions of any law, rule, or regulation to the contrary.

Section 5. If any part of this Ordinance shall be deemed invalid, such parts shall be severed and the invalidity thereby shall not affect the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 6. A copy of this Ordinance and the Redevelopment Plan shall be available for public inspection at the office of the Borough Clerk during regular business hours.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and any publication as may be required by law.
