1. CALL TO ORDER:

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park was called to order on Wednesday, November 10, 2021 at 7:00PM in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building, 182 Market Street, Elmwood Park, New Jersey. On Roll Call Councilmembers: Balistrieri, Fakhoury, Fasolo, Golabek, Pellegrine, and Council President Wechtler. Also present were Mayor Colletti, Borough Administrator Foligno, Assistant Clerk Shanee Morris, and Borough Attorney Ingraffia.

3. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE:

Whereas Chapter 231 of the Public Laws of the State of New Jersey requires at the commencement of every meeting a Statement of Compliance be read by the presiding officer.

5. SPECIAL PRESENTATION BY FAIR LAWN VFW COMMANDER – DAVID BOONE

Mr. David Boone of the newly merged Willie J. Muligan VFW Post 281, presented a check in the amount of \$10,000.00 to the Mayor and Council as a donation towards the Vietnam Memorial. Mr. Boone stated how much the memorial meant to him and presented a small statue to the Mayor. The Mayor and Council then shared their appreciation to Mr. Boone for his donation.

6. PRESENTATION TO SPINATO FAMILY ON BEHALF OF SALVATORE SPINATO

Mayor Colletti recognized Mr. Salvatore Spinato for his services in World War II and gave a brief background of his role in the service. He then discussed the many years of work that Mr. Spinato has done for the community. The Spinato family accepted the award on Mr. Spinato's behalf and the Mayor and Council then shared remarks of gratitude for his service. The Borough Attorney also shared remarks of appreciation.

7. CFO ROY RIGGITANO – EXPLANATION OF BOND RATING

CFO Roy Riggitano provided a brief explanation of the Borough's bond rating. Mr. Riggitano stated it was up to the May and Council to determine if they should bond on projects or pay as they go but he also noted that Borough has an excellent bond rating. Mr.

Riggitano then stated the goal is for the Borough to be as close as possible to zero for the tax increase for next year. The Mayor and Council then asked questions related to their making a decision on whether or not to continue to bond on projects, which were addressed by Mr. Riggitano.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BOROUGH CODE CHAPTER XXIV, ENTITLED "WATER" SECTION 24-4 SUBSECTION 24-4.4 ENTITLED "EXCEPTIONS" SO AS TO INCLUDE CERTAIN LANGUAGE CREATING A SEASONABLE EXCEPTION AND SUBSECTION 24-4.6 ENTITLED "ENFORCEMENT" SO AS TO DESAIGNATE OTHER AUTHORIZED BOROUGH OFFICIALS TO ENFORCE THIS ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have become aware of certain hardship created on the residence for full compliance with this ordinance and in a effort to address those concerns; and **WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council find it necessary to allow seasonal discharge of and also create hardship exeptions to certain residents from the restriction setforth in this ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter XXIV of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park titled "Water" more specifically the reserved section 24-4 and 24-4.6 is hereby amended to read as follow:

24-4 Sump Pump and Groundwater Standard, Rule and Regulation.

24-4.4 Exceptions; Seasonal Waiver

- A. Any sump pump that is discharged to the street, right of way, or premises that is not creating a nuisance prior to the passage of this ordinance will be exempt; however, if at any time after the passage of this ordinance the conditions change and the discharge creates said nuisance, it will be considered non-compliant, and must be rectified in accordance with this ordinance.
- B. Exemptions is hereby allowed by the Borough, in the form of a seasonal waiver, which would allow the property owner to temporarily discharge directly into the street, right of way, between the April 1rst through October 31 of each year. However, the property owners shall not be allowed by the Borough, to discharge said water into the street, right of way, from November 1, through March 31.
- C. The property owners shall allow a Borough employee or designated representative of the Borough to certify that, prior to November 1 of each subsequent year, their discharge water connection has been removed from discharging water into the street, right of way, of the Borough. Failure to provide such certification shall place the property owner in violation and subject to the surcharge penalty as required under this ordinance.
- D. The property owner may requests from the Borough and exemption by submitting said request on an official form to be provided by the Borough Building Department for an exemptions to be granted in the form of non-seasonal waiver for a particular property owner who can demonstrate undue hardship because of unique or extenuating circumstances. A waiver would allow the property owner to discharge directly into the street, right of way, without seasonal restrictions. The non-seasonal waiver request shall be submitted to the Township Building Department in writing and, at a minimum, identify the property for which the waiver is being requested, the name of the property owner/applicant, and a detailed description of the circumstances justifying the request. Non-seasonal waiver requests shall be submitted on the official form provided by the Borough Building Department.

24-4.6 Enforcement

This chapter shall be enforced by anyone of the following designated Borough officials;

1. Building Department, Business Administrator, Police Chief, Director of Public Works, and the Borough Engineer.

2. Such shall, in pursuance of his or her duties herein, be deemed, for the purposes of this chapter, the enforcement agency.

SECTION 2. all remaining parts of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect except that any inconsistencies as to the above changes to this ordinance shall be superseded by the amendment herein.

SECTION 3. In the event any section, part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance or any remaining part of this Ordinance other than the part held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

WHEREAS, Designation I-G, General Industrial sites have been reviewed and adopted by the Planning Board consistent with N.J.S. 40:55D -64; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has determined that consistent with the Land Use and Housing Plan elements of the Borough's Master Plan requiring Zoning Board Approval in certain matters, that it is proper and necessary for the applicant for a permit to build or erect any building or structure designated as a Warehouse of Storage Facility encompassing Seventy Five Thousand Square Feet (75,000 sq. ft.) of land or more, be required to submit a site plan for review and approval by the Zoning Board of Adjustment;

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE 2021 CURB AND GUTTER REPLACEMENT PROGRAM IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$325,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake the 2021 Curb and Gutter Replacement Program at various locations in, by and for the Borough. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. The sum of \$325,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$325,000, and (4) \$15,500 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$309,500, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$65,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$15,500, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in

budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$15,500 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$309,500 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$309,500 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$309,500 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy <u>ad valorem</u> taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE 2021 ROAD RESURFACING PROGRAM IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$1,020,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake the 2021 Road Resurfacing Program at various locations in, by and for the Borough (including drainage improvements and curb and sidewalk replacement, where necessary), as set forth on a list on file with the Borough Clerk and hereby approved and incorporated herein by this reference thereto. Depending upon the contract price and other exigent circumstances, and upon approval by the Borough Council, there may be additions to or deletions from the aforesaid list. It is hereby determined and stated that said roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 2. The sum of \$1,020,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law, and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$1,020,000, and (4) \$49,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$971,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$140,000 which

is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$49,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$49,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$971,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$971,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes,

is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$971,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and

the Borough shall levy <u>ad valorem</u> taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilwoman Balistrieri spoke about Council Corner being very productive and mentioned Councilman Fakhoury came out along with a good amount of the public. She mentioned how things have been addressed as a result of Council Corner and that it's an opportunity for the public to voice concerns and ideas for the Business Administrator. He then went on to thank the Borough Administrator and the Attorney for always being there for him, also the residents for voting.

Councilman Golabek reported Progress

Councilwoman Pellegrine, for her Police update, mentioned that on November 20th at 10AM there will be a turkey give away and on December 3rd at 6:30PM there will be a tree lighting ceremony on the corner of Market Street and Mola Boulevard. The Police will be there with Santa and elves for children and pretzel and hot chocolate will be provided during the ceremony. For her Board of Health update, she mentioned the Rabies clinic taking place on November 17th from 5PM until 7PM at Fire House Number 4 on Mola Boulevard. Their next meeting will be December 13th. For the Residents Assistance Program, she thanked ASEZ who helped with the leaf clen up that took place on November 7th. She went on to say that the People's Pantry held a Turkey and breakfast giveaway which took place on November 8th, she thanked the Police Department, Fire Prevention, Angela Fava, and everyone else who helped make the day a success. Finally, she congratulated the Board of Education Elects and the Councilmember Elects Tanisha Dennis and Theresa Sheridan, she thanked all of those to ran in the election and encouraged them to keep following their passion. Councilwoman Pellegrine stated that she looks forward to working with Tenisha and Terri and then shared kind words about Councilman Fakhoury.
