### BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK WORK MEETING December 2, 2021 7:00PM

The Work Meeting of the Elmwood Park Mayor and Council for December 2, 2021 was called to order by Municipal Clerk Erin Delaney at 7:19PM. The Statement of Compliance was read.
