ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, ADOPTING A REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR BLOCK 1602, LOTS 2, 3, 4 AND 26 IN THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LOCAL REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING LAW

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, NJS.A. 40A: 12A-1, et seq., as amended (the "Redevelopment Law"), authorizes municipalities to determine whether certain parcels of land in the municipality constitute areas in need of rehabilitation or redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Redevelopment Law, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park (the "Borough") on March 17, 2021 adopted Resolution-125-21 authorized and directed the Elmwood Park Planning Board to conduct a preliminary investigation of Block 1602, Lots 2, 3, 4 and 26 to determine whether the area identified met the criteria set forth in the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, on July 14, 2021, the Planning Board held a public hearing in accordance with the Redevelopment Law at which hearing Francis Reiner, PP, the Borough's Special Planner presented a report dated April 21, 2021 entitled, "Preliminary Investigation for Determination of an Area in Need of Redevelopment, Block 1602, Lots 2, 3, 4 and 26";

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Redevelopment Law, the Mayor and Council of the Borough on October 21, 2021, adopted Resolution-402-21 designating Block 1602, Lots 2, 3, 4 and 26 as shown on the Tax Map of the Borough of Elmwood Park as an "Area in Need of Redevelopment, Non-Condemnation" pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law; and

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate and effectuate the proper redevelopment of Block 1602, Lots 2, 3, 4 and 26, the Mayor and Council of the Borough has determined that there is a need to develop and implement a redevelopment plan pursuant to the authority granted under the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A: 12A-l et seq; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough retained the services of DMR Architects, Francis Reiner, PP, the Borough's Special Planner, to prepare a Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, DMR Architects, Francis Reiner, PP has prepared and submitted to the Mayor and Council the Redevelopment Plan entitled "871 River Drive, 7, 9, 15 Norris Street Redevelopment Plan" dated May 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council finds that it is necessary to implement and adopt the proposed Redevelopment Plan entitled "871 River Drive, 7, 9, 15 Norris Street Redevelopment Plan" dated May 2022 prepared by DMR, Architects, Francis Reiner, PP; and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Plan entitled "871 River Drive, 7, 9, 15 Norris Street Redevelopment Plan" dated May 2022 prepared by DMR, Architects, Francis Reiner, PP, is on file with the Borough Clerk and provides the redevelopment standards for the Property, including but not limited to the goals and objectives as set forth and stipulated in the Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, the Planning Board shall review the Redevelopment Plan and transmit its comments relating to the Redevelopment Plan to the Mayor and Council in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7; and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of the comments of the Planning Board relating to the Redevelopment Plan, the Mayor and Council will adopt the Redevelopment Plan determining that the adoption of the Redevelopment Plan is in the best interest of the Borough of Elmwood Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.

Section 2. The entitled "871 River Drive, 7, 9, 15 Norris Street Redevelopment Plan" dated May 2022 prepared by DMR, Architects, Francis Reiner, PP and attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof, is hereby adopted pursuant to the terms of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et. Seq. of the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law.

Section 3. The Zoning Map of the Borough of Elmwood Park and the Zoning Ordinance of the Borough of Elmwood Park is amended to reflect the Redevelopment Plan and to provide for the property.

Section 4. The Mayor and Council hereby declare that it, without the designation of any other redevelopment entity as defined in the Redevelopment Law, shall exercise all of the powers and duties of the redevelopment entity for purposes of clearance, re-planning, development and redevelopment of the Property and without limiting to the generality of the foregoing, shall be the sole body empowered by the Borough to enter into redevelopment agreements with redevelopers, subject to such limitations and requirements as are prescribed by the Redevelopment Law.

Section 5. This Redevelopment Plan may be amended from time to time, by the Mayor and Council, upon compliance with all requirements of all applicable law.

Section 6. The Borough Council hereby finds and determines that pursuant to the entitled "871 River Drive, 7, 9, 15 Norris Street Redevelopment Plan" dated May 2022 prepared by DMR, Architects, Francis Reiner, PP, that there will be a need to designation a Redeveloper and the Redeveloper shall execute a Redevelopment Agreement, and all other documents necessary to bring the project to completion. Accordingly, a site plan and subdivision review shall be filed only by the designated redeveloper with the Elmwood Park Planning Board, prepared within the requirements of the Municipal Land Use Law N.J.S.A. 40:55D-1 et. Seq. in order for the Redevelopment Plan to be effectuated.

Section 7. If any part of this Ordinance shall be deemed invalid, such parts shall be severed and the invalidity thereby shall not affect the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 8. A copy of this Ordinance and the Redevelopment Plan shall be available for public inspection at the office of the Borough Clerk during regular business hours.

Section 9. All other ordinance or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Section 10. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and any publication as may be required by law.

AN ORDINANCE EASTABLISHING A "NO LEFT TURN" AT THE SOUTH BOUND LOCATION ON RIVER DRIVE AND THE ELMWOOD PARK HIGH SCHOOL ENTRANCE OR DRIVEWAY AMENDING CHAPTER VII, "TRAFFIC" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK MORE SPECIFICALLY ARTICLE 7-23, "TURN PROHIBITIONS"

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park have determined that hazardous conditions exist which require the adoption of traffic regulations prohibiting left-hand turns at certain designated intersections as a result of multiple complaints from the residents regarding vehicle turning in certain areas; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Elmwood Park finds it necessary to regulate traffic and has determined a need to regulate said traffic by prohibiting vehicles from making a left-hand turn from the southbound lane of River Drive, into the Elmwood Park Memorial High School property or driveway.

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Elmwood Park believes that these traffic regulations are necessary in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of those individuals who reside in the area of these designated intersections, as well as the safety of the public at large.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDANED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. That Chapter VII, entitled "Traffic" of the code of the Borough of Elmwood Park more specifically subsection 7-23 entitled "turn Prohibitions" is hereby amended so as to reflect and include the following no left turns wording:

No person shall make a left turn on River Drive from the southbound direction into the Elmwood Park Memorial High School property or driveway.

SECTION 2. The responsible department of the Borough of Elmwood Park shall be responsible and directed through the Borough Administrator to install the necessary signs at the above-mentioned intersection.

SECTION 3. Penalties for violation. Any person who violates the provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in accordance to the respective and appropriate fine sections of the Borough of Elmwood Park and or as set forth in the Laws of the State of New Jersey.

SECTION 4. Enforcement. The Police Chief and the Police Department of the Borough of Elmwood Park shall assist and enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. Repealer. All Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that same are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 6: Invalid Provisions.: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7: Effective Date.: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication thereof as provide by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER VII, "TRAFFIC" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK MORE SPECIFICALLY ARTICLE 7-14.1, "PARKING PROHIBITED DURING CERTAIN HOURS ON CERTAIN DAYS"

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park have been and are aware of multiple complaints from the residents regarding vehicle parking in certain areas; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council has determined that there is a need to limit and or prohibit and control such parking in certain areas; and

Same shall be designated as "SCHOOL BUS PARKING ONLY" between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday school days except for Saturday, Sunday, and Holidays

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE IMPROVEMENT OF 13TH AVENUE AND 14TH AVENUE (EACH FROM EAST 53RD STREET TO EAST 55TH STREET) IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$200,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake the improvement of 13th Avenue and 14th Avenue (each from East 53rd Street to East 55th Street), including road resurfacing, construction of ADA compliant sidewalk ramps and drainage, curb and sidewalk improvements, where necessary, in, by and for the Borough. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor. It is hereby determined and stated that said roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 2. The sum of \$200,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. It is anticipated that a grant in the amount of \$130,000 from the Bergen County Community Development Program, pursuant to the Federal Housing and Community Development Act, shall be received by the Borough to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof. Any of said grant funds so received shall be applied as set forth in Section 10 hereof. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law, and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$200,000, and (4) \$10,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$190,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$35,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$10,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$10,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$190,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$190,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$190,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, NJS.A. 40A: 12A-l, et seq., as amended (the "Redevelopment Law"), authorizes municipalities to determine whether certain parcels of land in the municipality constitute areas in need of rehabilitation or redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Redevelopment Law, the Borough Council of ("Council") of the Borough of Elmwood Park (the "Borough") on December 19, 2019, adopted a Resolution designating the Borough of Elmwood Park as an area in its entirety in need of rehabilitation pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law; and

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate and effectuate the proper use of the properties located in the Broadway area and vicinity, the Borough has determined that there is a need to develop and implement a rehabilitation/redevelopment plan for the properties located on Broadway and vicinity pursuant to the authority granted under the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A: 12A-1 et seq; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body retained the services of Topology N.J. LLC, a planning firm, to prepare a Redevelopment/rehabilitation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the planning firm, Topology N.J. LLC, has prepared and submitted to the Borough Council an amended redevelopment/rehabilitation plan designated as "Elmwood Park Broadway Redevelopment Plan" dated March 4, 2022; and

WHEREAS, due to the conditions of the properties identified in the Rehabilitation Area and described in the Redevelopment Plan, the Borough Council finds the specific areas as identified inclusive of Blocks and Lots of the Tax map of Elmwood Park, more identified in the Redevelopment Plan attached as Exhibit A, to be in need of Rehabilitation, and the Borough Council further finds that it is necessary to implement and adopt the proposed Redevelopment Plan prepared by Topology N.J. LLC which provides an overlay zone for the properties identified in Exhibit D; and

WHEREAS, the amended Redevelopment Plan, dated March 4, 2022, is on file with the Borough Clerk and provides the redevelopment/rehabilitation standards for the Property, including but not limited to the goals and objectives as setforth and stipulated in the Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, the Land Use Law the Planning Board shall review the Redevelopment Plan and transmit its comments relating to the Redevelopment Plan to the Borough Council in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7 of the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law; and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of the comments of the Planning Board relating to the Redevelopment Plan, the Borough Council will adopt the Redevelopment Plan determining that the adoption of the Redevelopment Plan is in the best interest of the Borough of Elmwood Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park as follows:

- **Section 1.** The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.
- **Section 2.** The amended Redevelopment Plan dated March 4, 2022 and attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof, is hereby adopted pursuant to the terms of NJ.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et. Seq. of the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law.

Section 3. The Borough Council hereby finds and determines that pursuant to the Redevelopment Plan, that there may be a need the designation of a Developer or Redeveloper, should same be needed the Developer or Redeveloper shall execute a Redevelopment Agreement, and all other documents necessary to bring the project to completion. Accordingly, a site plan and subdivision review shall be filed by the designated redeveloper with the Elmwood Park Planning Board, prepared within the requirements of the Municipal Land Use Law N.J.S.A. 40:55D-1 et. Seq. in order for the Redevelopment Plan to be effectuated.

Section 4. Should it be necessary the Governing Body may transfer or sell any municipal property pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 12A-8 g. and or lease or convey property or improvements to any other party pursuant to this section, without public bidding and at such prices and upon such terms as it deems reasonable, provided that the lease or conveyance is made in conjunction with a redevelopment plan, notwithstanding the provisions of any law, rule, or regulation to the contrary.

Section 5. If any part of this Ordinance shall be deemed invalid, such parts shall be severed and the invalidity thereby shall not affect the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 6. A copy of this Ordinance and the Redevelopment Plan shall be available for public inspection at the office of the Borough Clerk during regular business hours.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and any publication as may be required by law.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to make various public improvements and to acquire new additional or replacement equipment and machinery, new communication and signal systems equipment and new automotive vehicles, including original apparatus and equipment, in, by and for said Borough, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized, and the Borough Trust Fund moneys and the down payment appropriated, by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough.

Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the Borough Trust Fund moneys hereinafter appropriated, and (3) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (4) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (5) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

Section 5. The cost of such purposes, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$35,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 6. The sum of \$135,000 available in the Borough's Recreation Trust Fund is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvements to Borough Field authorized in Section 4.C hereof.

Section 7. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$49,500, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$49,500 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 8. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$972,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 9. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$972,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 10. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 11. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of the purposes to be financed with bonds or notes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 9.30 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 12. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$972,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 13. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 14. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 15. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 4 of this bond ordinance (except for Section 4.C). If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 16. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 17. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

WHEREAS, municipal staff and budgets are increasingly utilized to accommodate the requestors and commercial entities who bombard our municipality with public records requests to the extent that in some instances, additional personnel are hired primarily to handle such requests; and

WHEREAS, our municipality is already required by state law to post and provide certain information and documentation on their municipal websites, including but not limited to, annual budgets, annual financial statements, annual audits, public meeting notices and meeting minutes; and

WHEREAS, under existing law, OPRA fees are woefully inadequate for the amount of time and effort needed to search for documents; it takes valuable time away from staff—not only in the Clerk's office—but also among other departments that may be involved in the same request; and

WHEREAS, OPRA has become broadly construed in favor of access and the requestor and, a requestor who prevails in any proceeding in appealing a denial of access is permitted to collect exorbitant attorney's fees; conversely, however, the resources and guidance available to record custodians and municipal counsel tasked with responding to such requests has narrowed drastically in the ever-changing OPRA arena, muddied by subsequent, voluminous and oftenconflicting court decisions that contradict the original intent of the law and will continue to do so in the absence of necessary legislative reform; and

WHEREAS, OPRA law allows outside businesses, and activist groups to utilize municipal time and services for marketing leads or private commercial gain, and for litigants to use OPRA as a method of discovery; and

WHEREAS, a clear distinction needs to be made between individual and commercial and discovery requests; and

WHEREAS, serious concerns about breaches or misuse of personal information exist along with the potential for OPRA to be exploited and abused by requestors, as a threat, harassment, or retaliatory measure to bury local governments in hundreds of requests, not necessarily because the requested records are of any particular interest, but merely because they can and have been emboldened by the courts to do so, to the significant detriment of all other municipal business; and

WHEREAS, most importantly, OPRA must be reformed to enable municipalities, their respective record custodians and legal counsels to protect the safety and welfare of the general public;

WHEREAS, over the years, court decisions have chipped away at the reasonable expectation of privacy provision of the law, thus allowing the law to be molded and wielded as a tool that severs any sensible balance of transparency, and instead, now perpetuates rampant and dangerous degrees of for-profit data-mining, unsolicited marketing and uncontrolled publications of records on internet search engines specifically designed to circumvent and bypass what few protective measures currently exist under OPRA, and all while allowing the requestor to remain cloaked in anonymity, should they choose to exercise that option; and

WHEREAS, the pandemic has resulted in a startling and exponential rise in fraud and identity theft, crimes that were already notoriously difficult to investigate, track and prosecute; OPRA, left unchecked and unreformed, continues to add fuel to this already dangerous fire; and

WHEREAS, in a most reprehensible instance in the midst of the pandemic, the unthinkable happened when the young son of a U.S. District Court Judge was senselessly killed by an individual who had managed to compile a dossier of personal information about the Judge including a home address, ushering in the passage of Daniel's Law; and

WHEREAS, while this law as intentioned provides for necessary strides and long overdue amendments to OPRA, the scope of protection provided is critically deficient, the implementation creates challenges for custodians and municipal officials that remain unaddressed by law, with limited channels for guidance, while the vast remainder of the Open Public Records Act continues to be left

recklessly unreformed, potentially leaving any officials not covered under Daniel's Law or even, the general public at-large exposed to the whim of any nefarious OPRA requestor lurking in the shadows of those demanding transparency at any cost;

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill No. 4894, introduced January 17, 2019, calling for the creation of a study commission to review OPRA, to-date, has been left negligently stagnant and, to-date the legislative approach to addressing the dangers of OPRA have been fragmented, haphazard and contradictory at best, leading to a dire need for streamlined overhaul and reform, which, at a minimum should include the following:

- Immediate creation of a study commission on OPRA.
- Uniformity under the law: municipalities shall not be subject to any provision under OPRA that the legislature or other state agencies are, by contrast, exempt from.
- Provide a universal platform for clear and concise guidance for records custodians. Such guidance should be in place prior to any laws that impact OPRA going into effect.
- Require that official OPRA Request forms be used in order to be considered valid, including certifications by the requestor of (1) non-conviction of an indictable offense and (2) that information obtained will not be used for profit, solicitation, marketing or commercial gain, or published as part of a separate internet database or search engine.
- Prohibit OPRA requestors from remaining anonymous.
- Require that requestors provide a State of New Jersey address in order to be valid (OPRA should not apply to out-of-state requests).
- Prohibit requests for commercial purposes.
- Exempt email addresses (also serves as a deterrent to spoofing, phishing and other cyber scams and crimes).
- Exempt information maintained for emergency notification purposes.
- Exempt any information related to minor individuals, disabled persons and senior citizens as well as classes of citizens who are vulnerable to exploitation of their information.
- Exempt personal identifying information from Motor Vehicle Accident Reports, including driver's license numbers, dates of birth (DOBs), home addresses, VINs and registration/plate numbers, unless the requestor is a subject of the record, or their designated legal or insurance representative.
- Exempt pet license information to a need-to-know basis only (health department, police department, veterinarian of record, hospital, bite victim) to deter rising pet thefts and potential for targeted thefts of non-large-breed dog owners.
- Reaffirm exemption of unlisted telephone numbers, including personal cell phones.
- Exempt property owner names, CAMA Data and reaffirm the exemption of property record cards.
- Protections afforded under Daniel's Law should be afforded to all government officials, employees, volunteers and members of the general public as the threats from the disclosure of personal information is not unique to those rightfully protected under Daniel's Law.
- Provide a carve out for fee-shifting where a municipality in good faith and without clear guidance through Statute or case law denies a request or redacts information which could reasonably be interpreted as not subject to disclosure.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Elmwood Park finds it imperative that the New Jersey Senate and Assembly review and reform the New Jersey Open Public Records Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to all New Jersey State Legislators, the New Jersey State League of Municipalities, the New Jersey Municipal Clerks' Association, the Bergen County Municipal Clerks' Association, the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police and the Bergen County Police Chiefs' Association.

A RESOLUTION URGING THE NEW JERSEY LEGISLATURE TO AMEND THE BUDGET CAP LAW TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR INCREASING INSURANCE COSTS

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45, et al, a municipality is required to limit any increase in its levy to 2.0% and any increase in appropriations to 2 1/2% or the cost-of-living adjustment, whatever is less, over the prior year's final appropriations subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, all local public entities, including participating municipalities in the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund (MEL), has incurred an estimated \$50 million in COVID related worker's compensation claims and it is anticipated that these costs will continue to increase as a result of long-term COVID cases; and

WHEREAS, a 2021 New Jersey Department of Labor decision regarding worker's compensation funding has generated increased costs to the members of the MEL by over 10% in order to cover claims that were previously funded by the State pension system; and

WHEREAS, a recent amendment to the sexual molestation statute of limitations will increase total liability costs for members of the MEL system by an estimated amount of 6% in 2023; and

WHEREAS, the frequency of weather-related catastrophic claims and corresponding impacts are anticipated to increase property insurance costs by over 10% per year; and

WHEREAS, cyber liability events throughout the country have resulted in twice the amount of premium costs in 2022 and such costs are expected to accelerate at a pace far greater than the rate of inflation; and

WHEREAS, these increasing costs, regulations, policy decisions and environmental impacts are occurring when many other items and costs in municipal budgets are also increasing at an inflationary rate; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45 be amended to provide that appropriations in the first three years after the effective date of (this amendment) for liability insurance, worker's compensation insurance, cyber insurance, and property insurance be exempt from the Appropriation CAP and the Levy CAP.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution shall be sent to the New Jersey Legislative representative for the Borough of Elmwood Park.

RESOLUTION OF THE APPROVAL FOR OHM THEORY LLC TO RECEIVE A CLASS 5 CANNABIS RETAILER LICENSE TO OPERATE WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2021, Governor Murphy signed into law PL. 2021, c. 16, known as the "New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act" (the "Act"), which legalizes the recreational use of marijuana by adults twenty-one (21) years of age or older, and establishes a comprehensive regulatory and licensing scheme for commercial recreational (adult use) cannabis operations, use and possession; and,

WHEREAS, the Act establishes six (6) marketplace classes of licensed cannabis businesses, specifically including a Class 5 Cannabis Retailer license for locations at which cannabis items and related supplies are sold to consumers; and,

WHEREAS, Section 31a of the Act authorizes municipalities to adopt by ordinance the number of the Class 5 Cannabis Retailer licenses that will be available in a municipality; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park adopted an Ordinance which established that two (2) Class 5 Cannabis Retailer licenses would be available for a cannabis establishment to operate within the Borough (the "Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough's Ordinance created a Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board (the "Board") to act as the local Agency to process and administer the licensing procedures for the Borough and to make recommendations regarding same for submission to the Borough Council; and

WHEREAS, the Ordinance further established that the Cannabis Retail licensee be required to site his, her or its establishment within a designated area of the Borough known as the Cannabis Overlay Zone; and;

WHEREAS, OHM THEORY LLC, completed and submitted the required application and documentation to the Borough of Elmwood Park Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board required pursuant to Ordinance No.: 2113, Section 4-7.3(D)(1); and

WHEREAS, after careful review of the application, documentations submitted and a meeting with OHM THEORY LLC, the Borough of Elmwood Park's Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board recommends, by way of attached resolution, to the Mayor and Council the issuance of one (1) Class 5 Retail License to OHM THEORY LLC.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, that pursuant to the recommendation of the Elmwood Park Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board of the Borough of Elmwood Park, as follows:

- 1. The Mayor and Council hereby, after consideration of the recommendation made by the Elmwood Park Cannabis and Marijuana Administrative Board to approve the issuance to OHM THEORY LLC of one of its Class 5 Cannabis Retail Sales Licenses based on satisfying the Board's approval and the requirements ordinance.
- 2. The Borough Zoning Official has confirmed that OHM THEORY LLC's location at 213 Route 46 West is located in the C-G zone, which is suitable for cannabis retailers.
- 3. The issuance of a license to the license applicant by the Commission would not exceed the limit of such licenses as authorized by the Ordinance.

Nothing in this Resolution shall preclude the Mayor and Council from issuing additional resolutions of municipal support to other applicants, to the extent that may be permissible under the regulations promulgated by the Cannabis Regulatory Commission, nor shall it limit the Mayor and Council's authority with respect to any request for input from the Cannabis Regulatory Commission as to their preferred licensee should more applicants seek licenses within the Borough than are available under the Ordinance.

Nothing in this Resolution is intended to affirm that OHM THEORY LLC. will ultimately be granted a license from the Borough of Elmwood Park to operate a cannabis business within the Borough as evidence of compliance with the Borough's laws and regulations will be required to be demonstrated by the applicant at the appropriate time.
